WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB POLICY STATEMENTS

Under ASA Law and as part of the submission by the Warrington Swimming Club for Swim 21 accreditation the Warrington Swimming Club is required to publish to all its members the management and operational policies of the club. The requirement is further reinforced by the affiliation of the Warrington Swimming Club to the Amateur Swimming Association and to the Amateur Swimming Association North West Region.

For information to Club members the current policy statements under which the Warrington Swimming Club will operate in 2009 are as follows:-

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB EQUITY POLICY

The Warrington Swimming Club will ensure that equity as stated in the club rules is incorporated in all aspects of its activities and also recognises and adopts the Sport England definition of Sports Equity:

Sports Equity is about fairness in sport, equality of access, recognizing inequalities and taking steps to address them. It is about changing the culture and structure of sport to ensure it becomes equally accessible to everyone in society.

The Warrington Swimming Club is committed to treat everyone equally within the context of their activity, regardless of sex, ethnic origin, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation or political persuasion.

The Warrington Swimming Club is committed to everyone having the right to enjoy their sport in an environment free from threat of discrimination, intimidation, harassment and abuse.

All Club members have a responsibility to challenge discriminatory behaviour and promote equality of opportunity.

The Club will deal with any incidence of discriminatory behaviour seriously, according to the disciplinary procedures of the club.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB CHILD and VULNERABLE ADULT PROTECTION POLICY

As a condition of membership and affiliation to the Amateur Swimming Association the Warrington Swimming Club adopts the ASA Child Protection Policy and Procedures as set out in ASA Regulation 241.

All club members will abide by the following Code of Conduct:

Responsibilities

Warrington Swimming Club will:

1. Promote the health and welfare of children and vulnerable adults by providing opportunities for them to take part in swimming and water polo safely.
2. Respect and promote the rights, wishes and feelings of children and vulnerable adults.
3. Promote and implement appropriate procedures to safeguard the wellbeing of children and vulnerable adults and protect them from abuse.
4. Recruit, train, support and supervise its members to adopt best practice to safeguard and protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and to minimise risk to themselves.
5. Require members to adopt and abide by this Child and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy and these Procedures.
6. Respond to any allegations of misconduct or abuse of children or vulnerable adults in line with this Policy and these Procedures as well as implementing, where appropriate, the relevant disciplinary and appeals procedures.
7. Respect the dignity and spirit of all members of the club including children and vulnerable adults.
8. Establish supportive, positive environments for the purpose of healthy competition, skill development, fun and achievement.
9. Be prepared to intervene if a child or young person under the age of the majority is being abused or neglected.

10. Work towards eliminating harassment and abuse from sports environments.

11. Treat all members of the club fairly and equitably.

12. Review and evaluate this Policy and these Procedures on a regular basis.

Principles

The welfare of children and vulnerable adults is everyone's responsibility, particularly when it comes to protecting them from abuse. Children and vulnerable adults have a lot to gain from sport. Their natural sense of fun and spontaneity can blossom in a positive environment created by sports organisations. It provides an excellent opportunity for them to learn new skills, become more confident and maximise their own unique potential. This Policy and these Procedures are based on the following principles:

1. The welfare of children and vulnerable adults is the primary concern.
2. All children and vulnerable adults, whatever their age, culture, disability, gender, language, racial origin, socio-economic status, religious belief and/or sexual identity have the right to protection from abuse.
3. It is everyone's responsibility to report any concerns about abuse and the responsibility of the Social Work Department and the Police to conduct, where appropriate, a joint investigation.
4. All incidents of alleged poor practice, misconduct and abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately.
5. Do not take part in or tolerate behaviour that frightens, embarrasses, demoralises or negatively affects athletes self esteem.
6. All personal data will be processed in accordance with the requirements of the Data Protection Act 1998.
7. Engage in fair play both during and outside of all sports organisations activities, fair play is defined as showing considerate regard to athletes, personnel, parents,

spectators, officials and abiding by the decisions of the officials.

Review

This Policy and these Procedures will be regularly monitored and reviewed:

1. In accordance with changes in legislation and guidance on the protection of children and vulnerable adults or any changes within the Warrington Swimming Club

2. Following any issues or concerns raised about the protection of children or vulnerable adults within Warrington Swimming Club
3. In all other circumstances, at least annually.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB CODE OF ETHICS

All staff representing the club must:-

1. Put the well being health and safety of all members above all other considerations including development performance.
2. Comply with the codes, rules and laws within the guidelines as set out by the Amateur Swimming Association (ASA).
3. Work without discrimination on the grounds of race, colour, language, religion, birth or social status as set out in the Equal Opportunities Policy.
4. Respect the basic human rights, worth and dignity of each member.
5. Not encourage swimmers, volunteers, officials or parents to violate the rules of the club or of the sport.
6. Observe the authority and decisions of all officials.
7. Encourage all swimmers to obey the spirit of the rules and the laws both in and out of sport.
8. Ensure that all teaching, training and competition programmes are appropriate for the age, ability and experience of the individual swimmer.
9. Treat other competitors and teams with respect, both in victory and defeat.
10. To be able to present evidence of qualifications on request.
11. Treat all personal information about individual members as confidential except in exceptional circumstances regarding health and safety, medical requirements, disciplinary action or in accordance with Amateur Swimming Association Child Protection procedures and guidelines.
12. Display the highest standards of personal hygiene.
13. Not drink alcohol or smoke either before or during teaching or coaching sessions or competitions.
14. Seek ways of and be willing to increase the development of their current qualifications.

ASA / Institute of Swimming (IoS) Code of Ethics

This Code of Ethics was written with specific reference to Teachers and Coaches. However, most aspects of this Code are also applicable to other people involved in the sport. Therefore all Members of the ASA need to be aware that this Code also applies to them. Please see the accompanying Note for Guidance which does not form part of this Code but which are intended to assist Members in its interpretation.

The ASA and IoS acknowledge that a large part of this Code of Ethics has been derived from the code produced by the Industry Lead Body for Sport and Recreation. The Code published below will remain operational unless and until notice of any changes and amendments is given by the ASA.

The British Swimming Coaches & Teaching Association (BSCTA) endorses this Code of Ethics.

Teaching/Coaching and Instructing

Even though the NVQ standards focus on and describe work functions, they are based on a number of accepted assumptions and values, which underpin good practice in

teaching/coaching and instructing. The British Institute of Sports Coaches has articulated these into a **Code of Ethics** much of which has been incorporated into the following Code of Ethics for Swimming Teachers/Coaches. Throughout the following Code the expression 'Teacher/Coach' whether used in the singular or plural shall include all teacher/coaches, assistants and other helpers whose activities are connected with the disciplines regulated by the Amateur Swimming Association (the ASA) and all members of the Institute of Swimming (IoS). Where the context of the code admits the expressions Teacher/Coach and Sports coach this may also include Officials and others involved in the sport of swimming in any capacity.

The purpose of the Code of Ethics (referred to throughout the remainder of the document as the Code) is to establish and maintain standards for Teachers/Coaches and to inform and protect members of the public using their services. Ethical standards comprise such values as integrity, responsibility, competence and confidentiality. Individuals who are members of the ASA/IoS are deemed to have assented to the Code and as such recognise and adhere to the principles and responsibilities embodied in it.

The Code creates a framework within which Teachers / Coaches when engaged in sports coaching - in the fullest sense of the expression - should always work. The code has been written as a series of guidelines rather than a set of instructions. However violations of the Code may result in complaints being made to the ASA Judicial System and, in which case the relevant Tribunal in determining whether a conduct complained of has brought the sport into disrepute or amounts to a violation of the ASA Laws will consider the Code's provisions when assessing the guilt of individuals against whom complaints have been made and/or the appropriate sanctions to apply.

The Code

Issues of responsibility

Teaching/ Coaching is a deliberately undertaken responsibility, and sports Teacher/Coaches are responsible for the observation of the principles embodied in the Code of Ethics.

Humanity

Teacher/Coaches must respect the rights, dignity and worth of every human being and their ultimate right to self-determination. Specifically, Teacher/Coaches must treat everyone equally within the context of their activity, regardless of sex, ethnic origin, religion, disability or political persuasion. All club members should refrain from any conduct, which may constitute bullying.

Bullying may be defined as deliberately hurtful behaviour, usually repeated over a period of time. Bullying can be:

Physical e.g. Hitting, kicking or theft.

Verbal: e.g. Racist, sexist or homophobic remarks, threats, name-calling

Emotional e.g. isolating an individual from activities, putting them down, destroying self-esteem.

(See Notes for Guidance)

Relationships

The good Teacher/Coach will be concerned primarily with the well being, health and future of the individual performer and only secondary with the optimisation of performance.

A key element in a teacher/coach relationship is the development of independence. Performers must be encouraged to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance in training, in competition, and in their social life. Teachers/Coaches are responsible for setting and monitoring the boundaries between a working relationship and friendship with their performers. This is particularly important when the coach and performer are of opposite sex and/or when the performer is a young person. The Teacher/Coach must realise that certain situations or friendly actions could be misinterpreted, not only by the performer, but also by outsiders motivated by jealousy, dislike or mistrust and could lead to allegations of sexual misconduct or impropriety.

The relationship between coach and performer relies heavily on mutual trust and respect. In detail this means that the performer should be aware of the Teachers'/Coaches' qualifications and experience and must be given the opportunity to consent to or decline proposals for training and performance.

Commitment

Teachers/Coaches need to clarify in advance with performers and/or employer the number of sessions, fees (if any) and method of payment. They also need to explore with performers and/or employers the expectation of the outcome of teaching/coaching.

Teachers/Coaches have a responsibility to declare to their performers and/or employer any other current teaching/coaching commitments. Teachers/Coaches should also find out if any prospective client is currently receiving guidance from another Teacher/Coach. If so, that teacher/coach should be contacted to discuss the situation.

Teachers/Coaches who become aware of a conflict between their obligation to their performers and their obligation to their Governing Body or other organisation employing them must make explicit the nature of conflict, and the loyalties and responsibilities involved, to all parties concerned.

Co-operation

Teachers/Coaches should communicate and co-operate with other sports and allied professions in the best interest of their performers. An Example of such contact would be the seeking of educational and career advice/counselling for young performers whose training impinges upon the performance of their studies.

Teachers/Coaches must communicate and co-operate with medical and ancillary practitioners in the diagnosis, treatment and management of their performers' medical and psychological problems.

Advertising

Advertising by sports teacher/coaches in respect of qualifications and/or services shall be accurate and professionally restrained. Teachers/Coaches shall not display

any affiliation with an organisation in a manner that falsely implies sponsorship or accreditation by that organisation.

Integrity

Teachers/Coaches should refrain from public criticism of fellow Teachers/Coaches. Differences of opinion should be dealt with on a personal basis and more-serious disputes should be referred to the Governing Body (ASA) or to the IoS.

Teachers/Coaches must not encourage performers to violate the rules of their sport and should actively seek to discourage such action. Furthermore, teachers/coaches should encourage performers to obey the spirit of such rules.

Teachers/Coaches must not compromise their performers by advocating measures, which could be deemed to constitute seeking to gain an unfair advantage. Above all, teachers/coaches must never advocate the use of proscribed drugs or other banned performance enhancing substances.

Teachers/Coaches must treat opponents and officials with due respect both in victory and defeat and should encourage their performer to act in a similar manner.

Teachers/Coaches must accept responsibility for the conduct of their performers insofar as they will undertake to discourage inappropriate behaviour.

Confidentiality

Teachers/Coaches inevitably gather a great deal of personal information about performers in the course of a working relationship. Teacher/Coach and performers must reach agreement as to what is regarded as confidential information, i.e. not divulging to a third party without the express approval of the performer.

Confidentiality does not preclude the disclosure of information, to persons who can be judged to have a 'right to know', relating to performers when relevant to the following:

- Evaluation of the performer within the sport for competitive selection purposes and recommendations concerning performers for professional purposes;
- Pursuit of disciplinary action involving performers within the sport;
- Pursuit of disciplinary action by the ASA and/or IoS involving fellow coaches in alleged breaches of this Code of Ethics and Conduct.

Abuse of Privilege

The Teacher/Coach is privileged, on occasion to have contact with performers and to travel and reside with performer in the course of teaching/coaching and competitive practice. Consequently, a Teacher/Coach must not attempt to exert undue influence over the performer in order to obtain personal benefit or reward.

Personal Standards

The Teacher/Coach must consistently display high personal standards and project a favourable image of their sport and of teaching/coaching - to performers, other teachers/coaches, officials, spectators, the media and the general public.

Personal appearance is a matter of individual taste but the sports teacher/coach has an obligation to project an image of health, cleanliness and functional efficiency.

The Teacher/Coach should never smoke when teaching/coaching.

Teachers/Coaches should not drink alcohol so soon before teaching/coaching that their judgement may be impaired and the smell will still be on their breath when working with performers.

Safety

Teachers/Coaches have a responsibility to ensure the safety of the performers with whom they work as far as possible within the limits of their control.

All reasonable steps should be taken to establish a safe working environment.

The work done and the manner in which it is done should be in keeping with regular and approved practice within that sport.

The activity being undertaken should be suitable for the age, experience and ability of the performers.

Performers should have been systematically prepared for the activity being undertaken and made aware of their personal responsibilities in terms of safety.

Issues of Competence

Teachers/Coaches shall confine themselves to practice in those fields of sport in which they have been trained/educated, and which are recognised by the ASA and IoS as being valid. Valid areas of expertise are those directly concerned with sports coaching. Training includes the accumulation of knowledge and skills through both formal Teacher/Coach education courses and by experience at a level of competence acceptable for independent teaching/coaching practice.

Teachers/Coaches must be able to recognise and accept when to refer performers to other agencies. It is the responsibility of the Teacher/Coach as far as possible, to verify the competence and integrity of the person to whom they refer a performer.

Teachers/Coaches should regularly seek ways of increasing their professional development and self-awareness.

Teachers/Coaches should welcome evaluation of their work by colleagues and be able to account to performers, employers, Governing Bodies and colleagues for their actions.

Teachers/Coaches have a responsibility to themselves and their performers to maintain their own effectiveness, resilience and abilities, and to know when their personal resources are so depleted as to make it necessary for them to seek help and/or withdraw from teaching/coaching whether temporarily or permanently.

Violations of this Code

An alleged breach of this Code shall be grounds for making a complaint under ASA Law. This is a formal expression of dissatisfaction with the actions of behaviour of clubs, bodies, organisations or individuals or with alleged unfair practice in connection with the sport and will be dealt with by a Judicial Tribunal.

The procedures for making a complaint are set out in the ASA Judicial Laws, which are reproduced in the current edition of Laws of the Sport and the ASA Handbook. Any complaint relating to matter contained in this Code may be referred by the ASA Judicial Administrator for investigation as is required under ASA Law. Dependent upon the outcome

of the investigation the Judicial System may direct that the matter may not proceed as a complaint under the ASA judicial system. In such a situation the Chief Executive may authorise such other action for instance the offering of guidance of education support or the issue of a warning as to future conduct, as may be appropriate in the circumstances. Thereafter dependant upon the outcome of such other action the Chief Executive may refer the matter back to the Judicial System for reconsideration as to whether the matter may proceed as a complaint.

The ASA Child Protection Officer shall have the power in exceptional circumstances to commence or take over conduct of any complaint made in respect of any breach of any of the provisions of this Code.

Team Staff Appointments Policy

The policy of the Amateur Swimming Association and Amateur Swimming Federation of Great Britain is as follows:

Where one athlete aged below eighteen years of age is travelling they must be accompanied by one member of staff and parental consent obtained with regard to the identity of the staff member.

Where there are two or more athletes travelling they must be a minimum of two members of staff accompanying the athletes. Where the group of athletes are of mixed sex, there must be staff members of each sex.

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

Under the ASA/IoS Code of Ethics Honorary officials are entitled to expect the same respect and dignity of treatment as that to which employees are entitled. It follows from this that if an official is not performing satisfactorily in their role the official is entitled to be told, to be given an opportunity to respond to the criticism and the opportunity to improve.

Further, the Club may wish to consider establishing a mentoring system with senior figures(s) in the Club (possibly a Past President) offering guidance and support to officials and also encouraging the development of new talent to ensure successions within the Club's administration.

Conduct of Meetings

In particular any member wishing to make any direct overt-criticism of an official or other member of the club in a general meeting must advise the Chairman in good time to enable the Chairman to advise such person in advance of the meeting in order that he is able to prepare himself for such criticism.

Furthermore, as a separate obligation on the chairman of the meeting when an official or member is the subject of criticism the chairman must specifically afford such person the opportunity to respond to include if requested consideration of an adjournment to enable the person to collect their thoughts.

Any failure to follow these principles may give rise to a complaint to the Judicial System under the ASA/IoS Code of Ethics. It is not intended that the Code should be used to stifle democratic debate but ethical considerations and indeed common sense decency dictates that advance warning should be given to anyone who is to be the subject of criticism in a general meeting.

Bullying

The damage caused by bullying is frequently underestimated and can and does cause considerable distress and harm to children. It is important that all settings in which children are provided with services or activities promote a policy that is not tolerant of bullying. No swimmer will be able to reach their full potential if they feel they are the victims of bullying, by an adult or one of their peers. Tackling bullying must be the responsibility of everyone in the club.

Guidelines and strategies to support an anti-bullying policy

The chances of bullying happening in a club can be greatly reduced if there is a general atmosphere where members are valued and cared for. The following strategies, which are embodied in the ASA Code of Ethics, will support a club's attempt to prevent bullying:

- 1 Encourage an ethos of mutual respect for difference throughout the club
2. Give positive encouragement and promote the value of self and others

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT CLUB OFFICIALS and VOLUNTEERS

The essence of good ethical conduct and practice is summarised below. All volunteers must:-

1. Consider the well being and safety of the athletes before the development of performance.
2. Develop an appropriate working relationship with the athletes, based upon mutual trust and respect.
3. Make sure that all activities are appropriate to the age, ability and experience of those taking part.
4. Promote the positive aspects of the sport for example fair play.
5. Display consistently high standards of behaviour and appearance.
6. Follow guidelines laid down by the National Governing Body (ASA) and the club.
7. Hold the appropriate, valid qualifications and insurance cover.
8. Never exert undue influence over athletes to obtain personal benefits or rewards.
9. Never condone rule violations, rough play or the use of prohibitive substances.
10. Encourage athletes to value their performance and not just competition results.

VOLUNTEERS

All persons who apply for membership of the Warrington Swimming Club are assessed as to their ability. Following this ability assessment the coach then allocates the swimmer to the most appropriate ability group. The swimmers will then join the other members in that ability group.

Disabled swimmers making an application for membership of the club are treated in the same way as any other application for membership.

The Warrington Swimming Club provides training and career development opportunities for its entire volunteer members equal to a level that each volunteer member may wish to

3. Raise awareness of all to the possible cause and effect of bullying
- 4 Make it clear that bullying will not be tolerated and is unacceptable, but that both victims and bullies will be given the necessary support
- 5 Enable swimmers, coaches and teachers to understand that the club or the Association will tolerate no form of bullying, be it physical, verbal or emotional.
- 6 Enable members to feel confident that their concerns will be listened to and taken seriously
- 7 Publicise Swim line and the NSPCC Child Protection Helpline

Any club where bullying is evident but not addressed will be considered to be breaching the ASA Code of Ethics. Clubs should ensure that any bullying which involves children should be seen in the same light as other child protection concerns and the ASA Child Protection Procedures should be implemented if a serious concern is raised.

attain. In the past the club has provided support for its volunteer members in a number of ways, in that the club has supported the training of the swimming teachers and coaches in the club. Each year the club includes in the budget plans an element for the training and development of its volunteer members.

At present informal meetings are held following each swimming session in order to discuss any problems or changes that may be required in order to cover any absences within the administrative structure of the club. This process reduces the need to hold formal meetings but it is felt that an annual appraisal would help with the planning, recruitment and training of all future volunteers.

It is proposed that an annual volunteer members meeting be held in October each year to undertake an audit of the poolside support in order to identify any skills which may be of benefit to the long term development of the club.

The Warrington Swimming Club has now included this volunteer appraisal system into the action plans.

RECRUITMENT POLICY FOR VOLUNTEERS

The Warrington Swimming Club is always seeking new people who may be interested in becoming involved in some aspect of assisting the activities of the Club.

A notice on the Club notice board invites any person who is interested in assisting in any capacity in the Club to contact the Hon Secretary of the Club. The Club Volunteer Co-ordinator, who seeks to establish the particular area of interest or expertise of the individual concerned, then contacts any interested person. An invitation to work with or alongside a regular Club Official will then follow.

As a typical example:-

1. Any person who already has swim teaching experience will be introduced to the poolside staff who after liaising with the Welfare Officer might invite the Candidate to join the poolside staff.
2. A person with ICT skills may well be co-opted by the Officials already involved in this aspect of the Club management.

3. Anyone interested in becoming an Amateur Swimming Association Technical Swimming Official will be encouraged to attend a Timekeeper, Judge and Starter course and in the meantime be invited to gain experience at Club time trials and minor Club Competition.
4. Other people with no specialist skills are always most welcome to assist the Club Officials in such duties as checking swimmers into Club training sessions,

distributing forms as well as assisting with the selling of Club equipment and clothing.

5. If the volunteer becomes a Club member they will be eligible for election to the Club Management Committee after a minimum period of twelve months of membership.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB DISABILITY POLICY

As stated in the club rules the Warrington Swimming Club will ensure that equality of opportunity is made available to all the club activities and access to facilities is not restricted.

All Club members have a responsibility to challenge discriminatory behaviour and promote equality of opportunity.

The Warrington Swimming Club is committed to treat everyone equally within the context of their activity, regardless of any disability restrictions and such members shall have access to all teaching, coaching, training and education activities undertaken by the club in the furtherance of the Aims of the Club.

The Club will deal with any incidence of discriminatory behaviour seriously, according to the disciplinary procedures of the club.

The Warrington Swimming Club is committed to everyone having the right to enjoy their sport in an environment free from threat of discrimination, intimidation, harassment and abuse.

TITLE: USE OF CAMERAS / PHOTOGRAPHIC EQUIPMENT IN LEISURE CENTRES

Objectives

This document outlines **GOLDEN GATES LEISURE'S** policy regarding use of cameras and other photographic equipment for third party hirers delivering sessions to children.

Policy Detail

Cameras and other photographic equipment including video cameras videophones are not allowed in the Centre during public sessions.

A third party hirer requires the written permission from the Centre Management prior to using cameras and other photographic equipment.

If authorisation is granted in writing the hirer should initiate a system to ensure compliance with the Data Protection Act and child protection issues. This means seeking written authorisation from a Parent/Guardian if recording photos/video of any person under the age of 16.

The system for ensuring compliance must have written approval from the Head of Golden Gates Leisure prior to use.

**WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB
CONSTITUTIONAL RULES**

- 1. Name**
- 1.1 The name of the Club shall be Warrington Swimming Club, hereinafter called the Club.
- 2. Objectives**
- 2.1 The objects of the Club shall be to:-
 - 2.1.1 Promote for its members the teaching, development and practice of:-
 - 2.1.1.1 swimming.
 - 2.1.1.2 the game of water polo.
 - 2.1.2 Promote and conduct annually swimming championships.
 - 2.1.3 Raise public awareness of the sport and stimulate public opinion in favour of providing suitable accommodation and facilities.
- 2.2 In the furtherance of these objectives:
 - 2.2.1 The Club is committed to enter competitions and championships of the associations to which the club is affiliated.
 - 2.2.2 The Club is committed to treat everyone equally within the context of its activity. This shall be regardless of age, sex, sexual orientation, ethnic origin, religion, disability or political persuasion, on any grounds.
 - 2.2.3 The Club shall implement the ASA Equal Opportunities policy.
- 2.3 The Club shall be affiliated to the Amateur Swimming Association North West Region and to the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and shall adopt and conform to the rules of those Associations and to such other bodies as the Club may determine from time to time.
- 2.4 The business and affairs of the Club shall at all times be conducted in accordance with the Laws and Technical Rules of the Amateur Swimming Association (“ASA Laws”) and in particular:
 - 2.4.1 all competing members shall be eligible competitors as defined in ASA Laws; and
 - 2.4.2 the Club shall in accordance with ASA Laws adopt the ASA Child Protection Procedures; and shall recognise that the welfare of children is everyone’s responsibility and that all children and young people have a right to have fun, be safe and be protected from harm.
 - 2.4.3 members of the Club shall in accordance with ASA Laws comply with the ASA Child Protection Procedures.
- 2.5 By virtue of the affiliation of the Club to ASA North West Region, the Club and all members of the Club acknowledge that they are subject to the laws, rules and constitutions of:
 - 2.5.1 Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and
 - 2.5.2 ASA North West Region and
 - 2.5.3 the Amateur Swimming Association; to include the ASA/IOS Code of Ethics; and
 - 2.5.4 British Swimming (to include in particular the British Swimming Doping Control Rules and Protocols and British Swimming Disciplinary Code); and
 - 2.5.5 FINA, the world governing body for the sport of swimming in all its disciplines (together “the Governing Body Rules”)
- 2.6 In the event that there shall be any conflict between any rule or by-law of the Club and any of the Governing Body Rules then the relevant Governing Body Rule shall prevail.
- 3 Membership**
- 3.1 The total membership of the Club shall not normally be limited. If however the Committee considers that there is a good reason to impose any limit from time to time then the Management Committee shall put forward appropriate proposals for consideration at a General Meeting of the Club. The members shall have the right to impose and remove from time to time any limits on total membership, or on any category of membership, of the Club.
- 3.2 All persons who assist in any way with the activities of the club shall become members of the club and hence of the ASA and the relevant ASA membership fee shall be paid.
- 3.3 Paid instructors, teachers and coaches who are not members of the club must be members of a body which accepts that its members are bound by the ASA’s Code of Ethics, the Laws relating to Child Protection and those parts of the Judicial Laws, Judicial Rules and procedures necessary for their implementation and whilst engaged in activities under the jurisdiction of the ASA shall be subject to all the constraints and privileges of the Judicial Laws and Rules.
- 3.4 Any person who wishes to become a member of the Club must submit a signed application form to the Membership Secretary. In the case of application for junior membership the parent or guardian of the applicant must sign the application form.
- 3.5 Election to membership shall be at the discretion of the Management Committee but other person(s) authorised by the Committee may make recommendation as to the applicants’ acceptability. The Committee or such other authorised person(s) shall be required to give reasons for the refusal of any application for membership. Any person refused membership may seek a review of this decision before a Review Panel appointed by the Committee comprised of not less than three members, who may or may not be members of the Committee. The person refused membership shall be entitled to make representations to the Review Panel. The procedures for review shall be at the discretion of the Panel whose decision shall be final and binding. The category of membership shall be as decided in accordance with Rule 3.9.
- 3.6 All memberships shall be renewed on an annual basis through the process of re-application not later than 1st January.
- 3.7 The Club may refuse membership only for good and sufficient cause, such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club or the sport into disrepute.
- 3.8 The Club shall not refuse an application for membership on discriminatory grounds, whether in relation to ethnic origin, age, sex, sexual orientation, religion, disability, political persuasion or sexual orientation.

- 3.9 The membership of the club shall consist of the following categories:-
- 3.9.1 Senior Members, who shall be not less than 18 years of age, shall be eligible to hold office, and to attend and vote at Committee and General Meetings.
- 3.9.2 Junior Members, who shall be less than 18 years of age, shall not be allowed to hold office, attend meetings of the Committee unless by invitation of the Committee or vote at Committee or General Meetings.
- 3.9.3 Honorary Members, who shall be elected by the Management Committee for such a period as they think fit and they shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership except that they shall not be entitled to vote at meetings and serve as officers or on the Management Committee unless any such person shall have retained in addition his ordinary membership of the club. Such Honorary Members must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.4 Life Members, who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting on a recommendation made by the Management Committee in recognition of outstanding services rendered to the Club. Life members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership and must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.5 Associate Members, who shall be elected by the Management Committee in recognition of support or services rendered to the Club. Associate Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership including the right to vote at General Meetings, to hold office and be elected to the Management or other Committees and must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.6 Temporary Members, who are individuals granted temporary membership by the ASA by virtue of their participation in specific event(s) organised by the Club in conjunction with a club, body, association or organisation under the provision of the ASA Law on temporary membership.
- 3.10 The Management Committee shall, from time to time, have the power to divide any category of membership into different elements to meet any specific needs of the club and to recognise special groups of members and/or special circumstances of membership.

4 Membership and Other Fees

- 4.1 The Management Committee shall determine from time to time the annual membership fee and the Management Committee shall in so doing make special provision for different classes of membership, and any element of a category of membership, as it shall determine.
- 4.2 The annual subscription fee shall be due on joining the Club and thereafter on the 1st January each year.
- 4.3 Any member whose subscription is unpaid by 1st March may be suspended by the Management Committee from some or all Club activities from a date to be determined by the Management Committee and until such payment is made
- 4.4 The Management Committee shall, from time to time, have the power to determine the annual membership fee and other fees. This shall include the power to

make such increase in the subscription as shall, where the Club pays the individual ASA Membership Fees to the ASA on behalf of members, be consequential upon an increase in individual ASA membership fees.

- 4.5 The Management Committee shall have the power in special circumstances to remit the whole or part of the ASA or Club fees to address issues of social inclusion.

5 Resignation

- 5.1 A member wishing to resign membership of the Club must give to the Secretary written notice of his/her resignation. A member's resignation shall only take effect when agreed by the Management Committee and there is no outstanding financial commitment or disciplinary action outstanding against the individual, as noted in Rule 6.1 to Rule 6.4 inclusive.
- 5.2 A member who resigns from membership of the club in accordance with Rule 5.1 above shall not be entitled to have any part of the annual membership fee or any other fees returned.
- 5.3 Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 5.1 above a member whose subscription is more than three months in arrear shall be deemed to have resigned. Where the membership of a member shall be terminated in this way he/she shall be informed in writing that he/she is no longer a member of the club by a notice handed to him/her or sent by post to his/her last known address.
- 5.4 The ASA shall be informed should a member resign from the club with financial obligations or in possession of goods or equipment belonging to the club.

6 Expulsion and other Disciplinary Action

- 6.1 The Management Committee shall have the power to expel a member when, in its opinion, it would not be in the interests of the Club for him/her to remain a member. The Club in exercising this power shall comply with the provisions of Rules 6.3 and 6.4 below
- 6.2 Upon expulsion the former member shall not be entitled to have any part of the annual membership fee or any other fees refunded and must return any Club or external body's trophy or trophies held forthwith.
- 6.3 The Club shall adopt and comply with the requirements and procedures of the ASA Laws and Regulations for handling Internal Club Disputes as the same may be revised from time to time.
- 6.4 A member may not be expelled or, subject to Rule 6.5 below, be made the subject of any other penalty unless the panel hearing the dispute shall, by a two-thirds majority, vote in favour of the expulsion or any other penalty imposed upon the member.
- 6.5 The Officers of the Club, or any other person to whom the Management Committee shall delegate this power, may temporarily suspend or exclude a member from particular training sessions and/or wider club activities, when in their opinion, such action is in the interests of the Club. Where such disciplinary action is taken the incident or matter it shall be dealt with in accordance with the appropriate Judicial Rules and Regulations.

- 6.6 The Officials in charge of a particular event or activity shall be responsible for the discipline. If further action is required this shall be referred to the Internal Disputed procedure as laid down in ASA Judicial Laws and Regulations.
- 7. Management Committee**
- 7.1 The Management Committee shall consist of:-
- 7.1.1 The elected members, who shall be:-
- 7.1.1.1 The Chairman
- 7.1.1.2 The Vice Chairman
- 7.1.1.3 The Treasurer
- 7.1.1.4 The Secretary
- 7.1.1.5 Six members
- 7.1.2 The appointed members, who shall be:-
- 7.1.2.1 The Chief Swimming Coach.
- 7.1.2.2 The Chief Water Polo Coach
- 7.2 All the members of the Management Committee shall be members of the Club and must be not less than 18 years of age though the Management Committee may allow younger member(s) to attend their meetings by invitation of the Committee without the power to vote.
- 7.3 The Committee shall appoint a member of the Club as Welfare Officer who must be not less than 18 years of age, who should have an appropriate background and who is required to undertake appropriate training in accordance with ASA Child Safeguarding courses. The Welfare Officer will have a right to attend Committee meetings without a power to vote.
- 7.4 The members of the Management Committee, with the exception of the appointed members, shall be proposed, seconded and elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting each year and shall remain in office until their successors are elected at the next Annual General Meeting. Retiring members of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election.
- 7.5 In the event of any member of the Management Committee, with the exception of the appointed members, not attending four consecutive committee meetings, it shall be considered equivalent to their resignation and the committee shall proceed to fill the vacancy, unless the committee are satisfied that such absence is unavoidable and have been notified of the same.
- 7.6 Management Committee meetings shall be held not less than once a month, save where the Management Committee itself shall by a simple majority resolve not to meet. The Chairman and the Secretary shall have discretion to call further meetings of the Committee if they consider it to be in the interests of the Club.
- 7.7 The quorum for a Management Committee meeting shall be six members entitled to attend and vote, to include not less than one Officer. In the event that a quorum is not present within thirty minutes of the published start time, a meeting shall stand adjourned to the time and date falling seven days after the date of the meeting, or such other date and time the Chairman may determine. If a quorum is not present at the adjourned meeting then those Committee members attending may act for the purpose of calling a Special General Meeting of the members, to which the provisions as to minimum notice contained in Rule 11.1 shall not apply.
- 7.8 The Secretary shall give all the members of the Management Committee not less than **seven** days written notice of a meeting and the necessary supporting papers.
- 7.9 Decisions of the Management Committee shall be made by a simple majority of those present and entitled to vote. Each member of the Committee who is entitled to vote, with the exception of the Chairman, or the acting Chairman for that meeting, shall have one vote. In the event of equality of votes the Chairman, or the acting Chairman of that meeting, shall have a casting or additional vote.
- 7.10 The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Management Committee. In the absence of the Chairman the Vice Chairman shall take the chair. If the Vice Chairman is not available or is unwilling to take the chair the committee, from among its membership, shall select an acting Chairman for the meeting.
- 7.11 The Secretary, or in the absence of the Secretary a member of the Management Committee, shall take the minutes of the meeting.
- 7.12 The Management Committee shall be responsible for:-
- 7.12.1 observing, obeying and enforcing the laws, regulations and technical rules of the ASA and the ASA North West Region.
- 7.12.2 the management of the Club subject to the strategic direction of the ASA, the ASA North West Region and the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association;
- 7.12.3 ensuring that an independent examiner, appointed by the members in a General meeting, examines the Accounts of the Club for each financial year and is independent of the members of the committee and is not a member of the family of a committee member
- 7.12.4 appointing as and when required a Welfare Officer, who shall not be a member of the committee, the coaching and teaching staff or the Team Manager and shall report to the committee on all issues relating to the welfare of the club members.
- 7.12.5 Appointing any officers, co-ordinators and members of any sub committee or working group, not elected by a General meeting.
- 7.12.6 Monitoring and evaluating the work of any sub committee or working group and any other person appointed to a specific task within the club, including the production of full and accurate minutes of their meetings and reports of their activities.
- 7.12.7 Any other question not herein provided for. The decision of the Management Committee shall be final.
- 7.13 The Management Committee shall have the power:-
- 7.13.1 and the sole right of appointing and determining the terms and conditions of service of employees of the Club;
- 7.13.2 to enter into contracts for the purposes of the Club on behalf of all the members of the Club.
- 7.13.3 to make regulations and to settle disputed points not otherwise provided for in this Constitution.
- 7.14 The Management Committee shall appoint the following, who shall be not less than 18 years of age and shall be members of the club:-

- 7.14.1 from time to time, as required
- 7.14.1.1 The Chief Swimming Coach
- 7.14.1.2 The Chief Water Polo Coach
- 7.14.1.3 A Welfare Officer who shall not be a member of the teaching and coaching staff or the Team Manager or a member of the family of an officer, committee member, the teaching and coaching staff or the Team Manager. The Welfare Officer shall not be a member of the committee and shall report to the Committee on all aspects of welfare concerning members of the club.
- 7.14.2 at the first meeting following the Annual General Meeting, from among the Management Committee Members:-
- 7.14.2.1 The Water Polo Secretary.
- 7.14.2.2 The Championship Secretary
- 7.14.2.3 The Membership Secretary and Registration Officer.
- 7.14.2.4 The Swim 21 Co-ordinator.
- 7.14.2.5 A member of the Executive Committee.
- 7.14.3 at the first meeting following the Annual General Meeting, as required, appoint from the membership of the club:-
- 7.14.3.1 The required number of delegates to the organisations and associations to which the club is affiliated.
- 7.14.3.2 A Schools Liaison Officer.
- 7.14.3.3 A Publicity Officer
- 7.14.3.4 Other persons as required.
- 7.15 The Management Committee may:-
- 7.15.1 Fill any vacancy occurring by resignation or otherwise. Any member so chosen shall retire at the next Annual General meeting but shall be eligible for re-election at that meeting. See also Rule 8.2.
- 7.15.2 Discharge by a two-thirds majority of those voting, for any breach of and under the provisions of the ASA Code of Conduct for Volunteers, any volunteer person from any elected or appointed office or position and replace them.
- 7.15.3 At its discretion discharge any sub committee or working group and elect a new one in its place.
- 7.15.4 In addition to the members so elected, co-opt up to a maximum of two further members of the Club who shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting. Co-opted members shall be entitled to vote at the meetings of the Committee but shall not be counted in establishing whether a quorum is present.
- 7.15.5 From time to time appoint from among its number, or otherwise, such sub-committees or working groups as it may consider necessary and to remove, in whole or in part, or vary the terms of reference of such sub-committees or working groups and may delegate to them such of the powers and duties of the Committee as the Committee may determine. All sub-committees or working groups shall periodically report their proceedings to the Committee and shall conduct their business in accordance with the directions of the Committee.
- 7.16 The members of the Management Committee shall be indemnified by the members of the Club against all liabilities properly incurred by them in the management of the affairs of the Club.
- 7.17 The Management Committee shall ensure that the financial records and minutes of meetings are retained for a period of at least 6 years.
- 7.18 The Management Committee shall maintain an Accident Book in which all accidents to club members at swimming related activities shall be recorded. Details of such accidents shall be reported to the ASA Office. The Club shall make an annual return to the ASA in the prescribed form
- 8 Officers and Executive Committee**
- 8.1 The Officers of the Club shall be the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, the Secretary and the Treasurer.
- 8.2 The Officers of the Club shall be proposed, seconded and elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting and shall hold office until the next Annual General Meeting when they shall retire. The Committee may fill any vacancy occurring by resignation or otherwise. Retiring officers shall be eligible for re-election.
- 8.3 The Executive Committee shall consist of:-
- 8.3.1 The Officers of the Club
- 8.3.2 A member appointed by and from the Management Committee.
- 8.3.3 Specialist individuals invited to address the Executive Committee on specific items as and when decided by the Executive Committee.
- 8.4 Executive Committee meetings shall be held not less than bi-monthly, normally in the period between the meetings of the Executive Committee, save where the Executive Committee shall by a simple majority resolve not to meet. The Chairman and the Secretary shall have discretion to call further meetings of the Committee if they consider it to be in the interests of the club.
- 8.5 The quorum for a meeting of the Executive Committee shall be three members entitled to attend and vote. In the event that a quorum is not present within thirty minutes of the published start time, a meeting shall stand adjourned to the time and date falling seven days after the date of the meeting, or such other date and time as the Chairman may determine. If a quorum is not present at the adjourned meeting then those Committee members attending may act for the purpose of calling a Special General Meeting of the Management Committee, to which the provisions as to minimum notice contained in 7.7 shall not apply.
- 8.6 The Secretary shall give all the members of the Executive Committee not less than seven days written notice of a meeting and the necessary supporting papers.
- 8.7 Decisions of the Executive Committee shall be made by a simple majority of those present and entitled to vote. Each member of the Committee who is entitled to vote, with the exception of the Chairman, or the acting Chairman for that meeting, shall have one vote. In the event of equality of votes the Chairman, or the acting Chairman of that meeting, shall have a casting or additional vote.

- 8.8 The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Executive Committee. In the absence of the Chairman the Vice Chairman shall take the chair. If the Vice Chairman is not available or is unwilling to take the chair the committee, from among its membership, shall select an acting Chairman for the meeting.
- 8.9 The Secretary, or in the absence of the Secretary a member of the Executive Committee, shall take the minutes of the meeting.
- 8.10 The Executive Committee shall be responsible for but not limited to, to:-
- 8.10.1 produce the Strategic Plan for submission to and approval of the Management Committee, subject to the requirements of the associations and other bodies to which the club is affiliated, including the Swim 21 accreditation programme.
- 8.10.2 produce the Business Plan for the club including the budget requirements for submission to and approval of the Management Committee.
- 8.10.3 produce the Development Plan for submission to and approval of the Management Committee.
- 8.10.4 report to the Management Committee on the progress made against the Strategic Plan and the Business Plan and make recommendations for further action.
- 8.10.5 deal with any matters referred to it by the Annual General Meeting, any Special General meeting or the Management Committee.
- 8.10.6 report any actions taken to the next meeting of the Management Committee following or at such other times and in such form as the Management Committee may require.
- 9 Annual General Meeting**
- 9.1 The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held each year on a date in November. The Management Committee shall fix the date, time and venue of the Annual General Meeting.
- 9.2 The purpose of the Annual General Meeting is to transact the following business:
- 9.2.1 to receive and comment on the Management Committee report of the activities of the Club during the previous year, which shall include the reports of the Chairman, the Secretary, the Chief Swimming Coach, the Chief Water Polo Coach, the club delegates and the reports of any sub committee or working group.
- 9.2.2 to receive and consider the accounts of the Club for the previous year, the report on the accounts of the independent examiner and the Treasurer's report as to the financial position of the Club;
- 9.2.3 to remove and elect the independent examiner, who must not be a member of the Committee or a member of the family of a member of the Committee;
- 9.2.4 to receive and comment on the reports of the delegates appointed to each association and organisation to which the club is affiliated.
- 9.2.5 to elect the following Officers and members of the Management Committee who shall be members of the club and shall be not less than 18 years of age;
- 9.2.5.1 Chairman.
- 9.2.5.2 Vice Chairman.
- 9.2.5.3 Treasurer.
- 9.2.5.4 Secretary.
- 9.2.5.5 Six other members
- 9.2.6 to decide on any resolution, which may be duly submitted in accordance with Rule 9.4.
- 9.3 Nominations for election of members to the position of President, to any office or for membership of the Management Committee shall be made in writing to the Secretary not later than 21 days prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting or of a Special General Meeting. The nomination form shall indicate in writing the willingness of the nominee to stand for election and contain the signatures of the proposer and the seconder.
- 9.4 Notice of any resolution proposed to be moved at the Annual General Meeting shall be given in writing to the Secretary not later than 21 days prior to the meeting.
- 10 Special General Meeting**
- 10.1 A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by:-
- 10.1.1 the Management Committee.
- 10.1.2 the Secretary within 28 days of receipt of a requisition in writing signed by not less than 20 members entitled to attend and vote at a General Meeting, stating the purposes for which the meeting is required and the resolutions proposed.
- 10.1.3 as directed by the Annual General meeting.
- 11 Procedure at the Annual and Special General Meetings**
- 11.1 The Secretary shall personally be responsible for:-
- 11.1.1 sending to each senior member at the last known address a written agenda giving notice of the date, time and place of any General Meeting together with the resolutions to be proposed thereat at least 14 days before the date of the meeting.
- 11.1.2 in the case of the Annual General Meeting sending to each member a copy of the Management Committee report, a copy of the delegate's reports, a list of the nominees for the Officers and the Management Committee posts, a copy of the examined accounts and the resolutions to be considered.
- 11.1.3 with the agreement of the member(s) concerned distribute these materials by e-mail or similar form of communication.
- 11.1.4 displaying the Notice of the Meeting on the Club Notice Boards where they exist.
- 11.2 All business of an Annual General Meeting or of a Special General Meeting shall be printed on the agenda and no other motion shall be discussed therein except:-
- 11.2.1 to record the name of the Chairman;
- 11.2.2 to record the name of the Secretary;
- 11.2.3 for adjournment;
- 11.2.4 for leave to withdraw a motion;
- 11.2.5 for a vote of thanks;
- 11.2.6 for permission to withdraw.
- 11.3 The quorum for the Annual and Special General Meetings shall be ten members entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting, which must include at least one officer.

- 11.4 The Chairman, or in his absence a member selected by the Committee, shall take the chair.
- 11.5 The Secretary, or in the absence of the Secretary a member of the Management Committee, shall take minutes at the Annual and Special General Meetings.
- 11.6 Each member present and entitled to vote, with the exception of the Chairman, shall have one vote and a simple majority shall pass resolutions. In the event of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting or additional vote.
- 11.7 Only members of the club who have reached their 18th birthday shall be entitled to speak and to vote on all matters. Members who have not reached their 18th birthday shall be entitled to be heard only on those matters determined by the Chairman as matters concerning juniors.
- 11.8 The Chairman shall at all General Meetings have unlimited authority upon every question of order and shall be, for the purpose of such meeting, the sole interpreter of the Rules of the Club.
- 12 Alteration of the Rules and other Resolutions**
- 12.1 Any proposal to change a Constitutional Rule shall only be considered at the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose. The Annual General Meeting shall consider and decide only the principle and intention of the proposal. The Management Committee shall draft the wording of the changes to implement the principles and intentions approved by the meeting or shall delegate the task to an individual or group of individuals appointed by the Management Committee.
- 12.2 A proposal to change a Constitutional Rule shall only be considered at a General meeting if it has been:-
- 12.2.1 included in the resolution or request for the meeting;
- 12.2.2 distributed with the supporting papers for the meeting;
- 12.2.3 made by a member of the club entitled to attend and vote at a General meeting;
- 12.2.4 made by a body, organisation or association, league or alliance to which the club is affiliated;
- 12.2.5 referred to the Management Committee, unless emanating from it. The Management Committee shall indicate its support or opposition and may propose amendments, which shall be included on the agenda of the meeting.
- 12.2.6 made as a matter of urgency, approved by the Management Committee, sent to the members entitled to attend and vote at a general meeting at least ten days before the meeting and approved as a suitable matter for consideration by the meeting by at least two thirds of the members present and voting.
- 12.3 Any proposal to change a Constitutional Rule, with the exception of proposals made by the Management Committee, may be proposed by any member of the Club supported by another member as a seconder who are entitled to attend and vote at a General meeting. All proposals shall reach the Secretary 21 days before the Annual General Meeting or Special General meeting called for that purpose.
- 12.4 Each proposal to change a Constitutional Rule and/or amendment to it shall be proposed and seconded separately and shall be open to discussion by any member entitled to attend and vote at a General meeting with or without prior indication of intent.
- 12.5 If any addition, alteration or recession of any ASA Law or Region Constitutional Rule to conflict with it, the Management Committee shall immediately cause the Club Constitutional Rule to conform to it. Any changes to the Club Constitutional Rule carried out under this Rule 12.3 shall be reported to the next Annual General or Special General meeting of the Club.
- 13 By-Laws and Standing Orders**
- 13.1 The Management Committee shall have power to make, repeal and amend such by-laws and standing orders as they may from time to time consider necessary for the well being of the Club which by-laws and standing orders, repeals and amendments shall have effect until set aside by the Management Committee or at a General Meeting.
- 14 Finance**
- 14.1 All moneys payable to the Club shall be received by the Treasurer and deposited in a bank account in the name of the Club. No sum above £10 shall be drawn from that account except by cheque signed by two of the three signatories who shall be the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. Any moneys not required for immediate use may be invested as the Management Committee in its discretion think fit.
- 14.2 The income and property of the Club shall be applied only in furtherance of the objects of the Club and no part thereof shall be paid by way of bonus, dividend or profit to any members of the Club, save as set out in Rule 18.3.
- 14.3 The Management Committee shall have power to authorise the payment of remuneration and expenses to any officer, member or employee of the Club and to any other person or persons for services rendered to the Club.
- 14.4 The Treasurer shall record the financial transactions of the Club in such a manner as the Management Committee thinks fit.
- 14.5 The financial year of the Club shall be the period commencing on 1st October and ending on 30th September. Any change to the financial year shall require the approval of the members in a General Meeting.
- 15 Borrowing**
- 15.1 The Management Committee may borrow money on behalf of the Club for the purposes of the Club from time to time at their own discretion, up to the limits on borrowing as may be laid down from time to time by a General Meeting, for the general upkeep of the Club or with the prior approval of a General Meeting for any other expenditure, additions or improvements.
- 15.2 When so borrowing the Management Committee shall have power to raise in any way any sum or sums of money and to raise and secure the repayment of any sums or sums of money in such manner or on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, and in particular by mortgage of or charge upon or by the issues of debentures charged upon all or any part of the property of the Club.

- 15.3 The Management Committee shall have no power to pledge the personal liability of any member of the Club for the repayment of any sums so borrowed.

16 Property

- 16.1 The property of the Club, other than cash at the bank, shall be vested in not more than four Custodians. They shall deal with the property as directed by resolution of the Committee and entry in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence of such a resolution.
- 16.2 The Custodians shall be elected at a General Meeting of the Club and shall hold office until death or resignation unless removed by a resolution passed at a General Meeting.
- 16.3 The Custodians shall be entitled to an indemnity out of the property of the Club for all expenses and other liabilities properly incurred by them in the discharge of their duties.

17 Competitions

- 17.1 No person shall be allowed to compete for the club unless he/she is a member of the club.
- 17.2 The rules governing the club swimming championships are deemed not to be part of the Constitutional Rules of the Club.
- 17.3 All trophies of the Warrington Swimming Club shall be considered perpetual unless the donor at the time of making the presentation to the club specifies otherwise.

18 Club Awards

- 18.1 The Club shall award Certificates for services to the Club in two categories as follows:
18.1.1 A Certificate of Achievement
18.1.2 A Certificate of Merit
- 18.2 The Certificate shall be awarded at the discretion of the Management Committee from recommendations or nominations received by the Secretary, in writing, at any time, from any source.
- 18.3 Certificate of Achievement
A Certificate of Achievement shall be awarded
18.3.1 To a person elected as a Life Member of the Club
18.3.2 To an individual, group or team, on the recommendation of the Committee or the Annual General Meeting, in recognition of a special performance in competition or any other action deserving of recognition by a member of the club.
18.3.3 For a substantial contribution to the promotion of any discipline at National,

Region or County level for and within the club.

18.4 Certificate of Merit

A Certificate of Merit shall be awarded:

- 18.4.1 To a retiring Chairman
18.4.2 To an Officer, Committee member or post holder of the Club with a minimum of five years service
18.4.3 To any sponsor or supporter who provided significant material benefit to the Club at any time.

19 Dissolution

- 19.1 A resolution to dissolve the Club shall only be proposed at a General Meeting and shall be carried by a majority of at least three-quarters of the members present and entitled to vote. A specific date for the dissolution shall be included in the resolution.
- 19.2 The dissolution shall take effect from the date specified in the resolution and the members of the Management Committee shall be responsible for the winding-up of the assets and liabilities of the Club.
- 19.3 Any property remaining after the discharge of the debts and liabilities of the Club shall be given to a non-profit making organisation having aims and objectives similar to those of the Club for the furtherance of such aims and objectives as nominated by the last Management Committee.
- 19.4 Any property remaining after the discharge of the debts and liabilities of the Club shall be divided equally among the members of the Club at the date of dissolution.

20 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- 20.1 The Members acknowledge that these Rules constitute a legally binding contract to regulate the relationship of the members with each other and the Club.

The following statement needs to appear on Club membership forms and is to be signed by the member and must also be countersigned by the parent, or a person having parental responsibility for the member, if under 18 years of age:

I acknowledge receipt of the rules of the Warrington Swimming Club and confirm my understanding and acceptance that such rules, as amended from time to time, shall govern my membership of the Club. I further acknowledge and accept the responsibilities of membership upon members as set out in these rules.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB
ASA LAWS and REGULATIONS

Under the revised ASA Laws and Regulations introduced from 1st January 2009 a Swimming Club has specifically defined Rights and Responsibilities under the condition of affiliation to the ASA and to a Region. A protest must now be handled within the requirements of a competition and a club can no longer deal with a complaint. All complaints must be passed to the ASA for consideration. However, it is now a mandatory requirement that a club has a procedure for handling all Internal Club Disputes in accordance with ASA Laws and Regulations. In addition, once a club agrees to host a competition it must comply with the necessary Health and Safety requirements and must satisfy the promoter's conditions for the competition. The move by the ASA to play all water polo matches in England under the FINA rules of water polo now places particular duties and responsibilities on the Referee(s) for the game. A number of the ASA Regulations relating to holding competitions are given below.

DEFINITIONS and LIMITATIONS
ASA Regulation 101 and 102

101. Protests

101.1 A protest is an allegation that the ASA Laws, Regulations, Technical Rules or the promoter's conditions governing a competition have not been complied with or have been misinterpreted.

101.2 A protest may be made by a competitor (who may nominate another person to act on his behalf) or a club, body or official taking part in the competition. A protest must be made orally to a referee, or if appropriate, to a water polo delegate, and confirmed in writing within thirty minutes following the conclusion of the event or match during which the incident giving rise to the protest took place unless the reason for the protest is known before the event or match, in which case the protest must be made as soon as reasonably practicable before the event or match starts. If a protest is made prior to the appointment of the referee(s) or the water polo delegate(s) then the protest should be made to the promoter who shall refer the protest to a referee or a water polo delegate when he appoints the referee(s) or the water polo delegate(s).

101.3 Where material facts are brought to the attention of a competitor, club, body or official taking part in the competition which if they had been known during that competition a protest would have been likely to have been made during that competition or within thirty minutes following the conclusion of the relevant event, a post-event protest may be made to a referee or, if appropriate, to a water polo delegate who may in his discretion deal with it as if it had been made under Regulation 101.2 provided he is satisfied that it would be in the best interests of the sport to do so and provided further that the individual or other person making a post-event protest did so as soon as was reasonably practicable after acquiring knowledge of those material facts.

101.4 A protest may not be made against a decision of a referee or any other official regarding placing, fouling or any other facts of a competition. A referee's interpretation of ASA Laws, Regulations, Technical Rules or promoter's conditions must be accepted at the time but may be the subject of a protest.

101.5 An appeal ("a protest appeal") may be made against the decision of a water polo delegate or a referee on a protest (Regulation 108.1).

101.6 the promoter of an event at which a protest has been made shall take possession of and store any documents relating to the protest and its resolution or otherwise, for a period of not less than 12 months after the event.

102. Complaints

102.1 A complaint is a formal expression of dissatisfaction with the actions or behaviour of any person, including an individual or a club, or other body, or organisation or with alleged unfair practice in connection with the sport.

102.2 If a person, club or other body or organisation is dissatisfied with a decision of a Committee appointed under Law 21 or Law 22 an appeal may be made by lodging a complaint with the Judicial Administrator under this Regulation 102 (See Regulation 159). In such cases only decisions of a disciplinary nature may be the subject of an appeal. Decisions made in the normal course of the business of a Committee on administrative and technical matters, appointments and selection of teams may not be the subject of an appeal.

102.3 No complaint may be made under the Judicial Laws or Regulations against an employee of the ASA relating to any action taken in the course of his employment. Any complaint about such an action shall be dealt with by the ASA and should be addressed to the Chief Executive.

102.4 Grounds for a complaint shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

102.4.1 Misconduct;

102.4.2 "serious misconduct"; being any action, behaviour or practice liable to bring the sport into disrepute;

102.4.3 Maladministration or breach of ASA Laws, Regulations or Rules, or the rules of a club, body or organisation etc.;

102.4.4 a breach of the ASA/IOS Code of Ethics.

102.5 A complaint may be made by:

102.5.1 any member who is aged 18 years or over on the date of the complaint;

102.5.2 the parent of or other person with parental responsibility for a member, who is aged under 18 years on the date of the complaint, on his behalf;

102.5.3 any affiliated club, body, organisation, association, County Association or Region through its secretary or other officer acting on its behalf;

- 102.5.4 the Board or any committee of the ASA, Region or affiliated organisation through its secretary or other officer acting on its behalf;
 - 102.5.5 a person officiating at an event;
 - 102.5.6 any member of an Associated Organisation, a Corporate Organisation, an Associate Association, or an Affiliated Body who is aged 18 years or over on the date of the complaint. Any such complaint may only be made relative to swimming related activities in which the complainant was engaged;
 - 102.5.7 the parent of or other person with parental responsibility for a member of an Associated Organisation, a Corporate Organisation, an Associate Association or an Affiliated Body, who is aged under 18 years on the date of the complaint, on his behalf. Any such complaint may only be made relative to swimming related activities in which the member was engaged.
- 102.6 A complaint which the Commissioner determines (in accordance with **Regulation 160**) raises an allegation which is properly to be categorised as misconduct and refers the matter

to be dealt with by a Disciplinary Committee shall be prosecuted by the complainant pursuant to the disciplinary procedure. (See Regulations 162 et seq.).

A complaint which the Commissioner determines (in accordance with Regulation 160) raises an allegation which is properly to be categorised as serious misconduct liable to bring the sport into disrepute and refers the matter to be dealt with by a Disciplinary Committee shall be prosecuted by a Disciplinary Officer pursuant to the disciplinary procedure. (See Regulations 162 et seq.).

Any other complaint that is permitted to proceed shall be decided by the Commissioner or dealt with under the dispute resolution procedure. (See Regulations 167 et seq.).

- 102.7 A complaint must normally reach the Judicial Administrator not later than thirty days after the alleged incident that gave rise to it.

INTERNAL CLUB DISPUTES

ASA Regulations 150 - 155

150 General

- 150.1 The primary objective of the Regulations in this section is to set out ways by which a just outcome of an internal dispute between the members of a club, organisation, association or body may be secured as expeditiously as possible.
- 150.2 An 'internal club dispute' is a dispute involving an alleged breach of the club's rules, between two or more club members, any or none of whom may be an officer of the club, or one or more club members and one or more employees of the club (the "parties").
- 150.3 If a dispute cannot be resolved fairly and amicably between the parties concerned, and does not involve a breach of ASA Law, it may be dealt with under the relevant provisions of Regulation 281 that deal with club rights and responsibilities.
- 150.4 Any dispute that involves an allegation that there has been a breach of ASA Law by a member must be dealt with as a Complaint under Regulation 102 and the other relevant Regulations.
- 150.5 If the dispute involves an allegation against a paid employee of the club the issue must be dealt with under the terms of his contract of employment.
- 150.6 A failure by a club or any of the parties to comply with these Regulations 150 to 155 inclusive shall be grounds for a complaint under Regulation 102.
- 150.7 Organisations, associations or bodies affiliated to the ASA shall conform with such parts of Regulations 150 to 155 inclusive as may reasonably be applied to them, in all respects as if they were a club.

- 151.2 If such a resolution cannot be achieved, the dispute shall be referred to the chairman of the club committee or, if he is a party to the dispute, to another officer of the club who is not a party who within seven days of the reference shall appoint an independent person to act as a mediator between the parties. The mediator may be a member of the club or a member of another club affiliated to the ASA.

- 151.3 If the mediator is unable to bring about a satisfactory settlement within twenty-one days, the club committee shall within a further fourteen days appoint a panel (the "panel") to determine the dispute.

151.3.1 The panel shall consist of three persons who have not been involved in the dispute, either from the members of the club or, if this is not possible or desirable, from the members of any other club affiliated to the ASA.

151.3.2 The parties shall be given the opportunity to object to any of the members of the panel at least seven days before the scheduled date of any hearing. The club committee shall consider any such objections, decide whether they are justified and act accordingly.

152 Procedure before a hearing

- 152.1 The panel members shall appoint one of their number to act as the Chairman and either appoint another of their number, or alternatively appoint an additional person without any other powers, to act as the clerk of the hearing.

- 152.2 The Chairman of the panel shall arrange the date of the hearing and notify the parties of the arrangements at least fourteen days in advance of the date set. The notified date shall not be changed unless one or more

151 Sequence of steps to deal with a dispute

- 151.1 The parties shall use any reasonable means to settle the issues between them informally and amicably.

of the parties has a compelling reason for not being able to attend on the notified day or time.

153 Procedure at a hearing

- 153.1 The procedure shall be flexible and it shall be the responsibility of the Chairman of the panel to ensure the orderly and effective conduct of the hearing.
- 153.2 The panel shall not be bound by the judicial rules of the courts of England and Wales governing procedure or the admissibility of evidence provided that the hearing is conducted in a fair and orderly manner and that each party is given a reasonable opportunity to give and call evidence, address the panel and present his case. The Chairman shall have the discretion to limit the number of witnesses that would otherwise have been called.
- 153.3 Witnesses shall normally be provided with an area outside the hearing room and not take any part in the hearing other than giving evidence and responding to questions
- 153.4 The parties shall be informed of their right to make a complaint under Regulation 102 if they are dissatisfied with the conduct of the hearing or the grounds upon which the decision was made or if they consider any sanction imposed to be disproportionate.

154 Procedure after a hearing

- 154.1 The panel shall come to a decision as soon as reasonably practicable after the hearing and if possible announce its findings and decisions orally to the parties.
- 154.2 Notwithstanding anything in Regulation 154.1 the Chairman shall notify the parties and, if the club was not a party to the dispute, the club secretary in writing of its findings and decisions within five days of the hearing.

155 Considerations regarding children

- 155.1 Any person under the age of eighteen (a "child") who is a party to a dispute or who has been called as a witness shall normally be accompanied by a parent, a person with parental responsibility or a suitable adult.

The Chairman shall have the sole discretion as to whether a child is permitted to present or defend a case or be questioned as a witness and may order that the child be assisted or represented by an adult.

- 155.2 The Chairman shall give due consideration to any child attending a hearing as a party to a dispute or to give evidence and in particular:
- 155.2.1 No child aged fourteen or under shall normally be expected to attend a hearing to give evidence in person. His evidence shall normally be given as a written statement with the assistance of a club welfare officer or other person acceptable to the child and parent. A panel member may relay questions and responses. If the child appears distressed the panel shall rely only on the written evidence:
- 155.2.2 A child over the age of fourteen shall only attend a hearing as a party to the dispute or to give evidence in person provided he wishes to, and the Chairman has consulted with the parent and child and is satisfied that they both understand the nature of the hearing and what will happen and that the child is competent to attend:
- 155.2.3 If there is a disagreement between parent and/or child and the Chairman on any of the considerations above, the Chairman shall consider requesting advice from the Independent Child Protection Officer via the ASA Legal Department.
- 155.3 During the hearing, a child who is expected to give evidence in person and his accompanying adult(s) shall be required to attend only those parts of the hearing which are necessary for him to give his evidence and shall be provided with a separate waiting area with no contact with any of the [other] parties.
- 155.4 After the hearing the Chairman shall inform the parent of the panel's findings and decisions and shall discuss whether he or the parent shall inform the child.

PROTESTS AND COMPLAINTS

ASA Regulations 156 - 159

156 Procedure to deal with a protest

- 156.1 The procedures for dealing with a protest are set out in Regulations 412, 413 and 414.

157 Procedure to appeal against a referee's decision on a protest

- 157.1 An appeal against a decision of a referee in regard to a protest shall be made by completing a standard protest appeal form (available from the Office of Judicial Administration), together with the appropriate fee. (See Regulations 101.4 and 110). The completed form (and any other communications to the Office of Judicial Administration under the ASA Laws and Regulations) shall be sent marked for the attention of the Office of Judicial Administration

158 Procedure to appeal against an automatic suspension for a breach of FINA Water Polo Rules

158.1 An appeal against the imposition of an automatic suspension for a breach of FINA Water Polo Rules shall be made by sending to the Office of Judicial

**HEALTH AND SAFETY
ASA Regulations 203 - 206**

203 Duties of all persons

Any person participating in any activity organised by an affiliated club, body or organisation including, but not being limited to, any promoter, competitor, official or spectator at any competition in any swimming discipline held in England under ASA Laws, Regulations and Technical Rules or FINA Rules shall:

- 203.1 comply with the following:
 - 203.1.1 any relevant statutory Health and Safety requirements;
 - 203.1.2 any bye laws or other regulations relating to safety;
 - 203.1.3 the conditions of any hire agreement relating to safety;
 - 203.1.4 safety instructions or guidance issued by the ASA or any other body approved by the Board.
- 203.2 take reasonable care for the health and safety of himself and other persons who may be affected by his acts or omissions within the area for which the promoter, hirer or organiser of the activity is responsible.

204.4 brief the referee(s) on the relevant sections of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures and the Promoter's Conditions prior to the competition;

204.5 appoint sufficient competent persons (each of whom shall be a member of an affiliated club) to organise and supervise warm-up and swim-down sessions during the period of hire and brief them on the safety aspects of their duties;

204.6 ensure before a competition is permitted to start that first aid and safety equipment to be provided by the Owner/Operator is in place and ready and available for immediate use and that pool staff who are qualified to operate it are on duty;

204.7 ensure that all stewards, lifeguards and other safety staff are in place before any participants are permitted on the poolside, and that adequate numbers are maintained throughout the period of hire;

204. Duties of the promoter

The promoter of a competition shall have overall responsibility for the observance and enforcement of the safety requirements and his duties shall include but not be limited to the following. The promoter shall:

- 204.1 agree with the Owner/Operator the areas for which the Promoter, as hirer, is responsible;
- 204.2 obtain a copy of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures from the Owner/Operator and have it available for reference during the period of hire;
- 204.3 make arrangements for the implementation of relevant sections of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures (as required by the pool hire agreement) during the period of hire;

204.8 prevent a competition starting if any of the required facilities and arrangements are absent or deficient;

204.9 be present throughout the period of hire of the pool for the competition or, for any period(s) in which he is not present, appoint a deputy to exercise the full powers of the Promoter;

204.10 ensure, before start of each competitive session, that announcements concerning safety arrangements are made in accordance with the recommendations of the ASA and indicating where a copy of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures can be seen.

205 Duties of the Water Polo Delegate or the referee

The duties of a Water Polo Delegate or referee shall include but not be limited to the following.

deficient and report it to the Promoter or his Deputy.

- 205.1 in addition to the duties set out in Regulations 414 or 415 and the relevant Technical Rules and conditions governing a competition, to be responsible for the safe conduct of all activities in those parts of the premises essential for the running of the competition;
- 205.2 to ensure that the minimum safe water depths and other dimensions and clearances, facilities and equipment comply with the current ASA requirements;
- 205.3 to ensure that all officials are briefed prior to the competition on the safety arrangements and on any general safety matters (e.g. evacuation procedures) required by the Owner/Operator;
- 205.4 to stop a competition proceeding at any stage if any of the required facilities, equipment, personnel and procedures become

206 Duties of officials and stewards

Any official or steward shall be under the control of the Water Polo Delegate or referee at all times and, in addition to the duties set out in ASA Laws and Regulations or the Technical Rules and conditions governing a competition, shall report immediately to the Water Polo Delegate(s) or referee(s) anything that appears to him to breach, or be likely to breach, the safety regulations.

CHILD SAFEGUARDING ASA Regulation 241

241 Child Safeguarding

For the purposes of this Regulation 241, “child” or “young person” shall be construed to include “vulnerable adult” and “children” or “young persons” shall be construed to include “vulnerable adults” as defined in the ASA Policy for the Protection of Vulnerable Adults.

241.1 No person shall be permitted to be involved in any way with children in the sport of swimming under the jurisdiction of the ASA unless:

241.1.1 he is a member of an affiliated club or of a club, body or organisation whose Child Protection Policies and the measures to enforce them are recognised by the ASA; or

241.1.2 if this is impracticable, adequate provisions are made by the organiser of the activity or the promoter of the event to assess the risk and ensure that appropriate measures to protect any children taking part are in place.

241.2 In this Regulation the expression ‘Offence’ shall mean any one or more of the offences against a child within the meaning of Schedule 4 to the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000 and any other offence which reasonably causes the Chief Executive to believe that the person accused of the offence is or may be a risk or potential risk to children or young persons.

241.3 Upon receipt by the Chief Executive of:

241.3.1 notification that an individual has been charged with an Offence; or

241.3.2 notification that an individual is the subject of an investigation by the police, social services or any other authority relating to an Offence; or

241.3.3 other evidence which causes the Chief Executive reasonably to conclude that an individual may have committed an Offence then in any such case the Chief Executive may impose upon the individual an interim suspension from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the ASA or any body directly or indirectly affiliated to the ASA wherever held.

241.4 Upon receipt by the Chief Executive of a recommendation from the ASA Independent Child Protection Officer including the results of a Criminal Records Bureau search or other information received which causes the Chief Executive to conclude on reasonable grounds that the individual concerned is unsuitable to work with or have unsupervised access to children within the sport of swimming the Chief Executive may impose upon the individual an interim suspension or a suspension for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the ASA or any body directly or indirectly affiliated to the ASA wherever held. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against the decision of the Chief Executive to impose a suspension under this Regulation 241.4 (see Regulation 108.8).

241.5 In reaching his determination as to whether an interim suspension should be imposed the Chief Executive shall give consideration, *inter alia*, to the

following factors:

241.5.1 whether a child or children or young person(s) are or may be at risk;

241.5.2 whether the allegations are of a serious nature;

- 241.5.3** whether a suspension is necessary or proportionate to allow the conduct of any investigation (by the ASA or any other authority or body) to proceed unimpeded.
- 241.6 Where an individual shall have been convicted or have been the subject of a caution in respect of an Offence the Chief Executive shall have power summarily to impose the suspension for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive of the individual from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the ASA or any other body directly or indirectly affiliated to the ASA wherever held. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against the decision of the Chief Executive under this Regulation 241.6 (see Regulation 108.8).
- 241.7 if a Local Authority forms a belief under the formal belief system derived from the Children Act 1989, as amended, regarding an individual's suitability to work with children the Chief Executive shall have the power summarily to suspend that person for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive from all ASA activities, provided that:
- 241.7.1 the Local Authority has informed the ASA that such a belief has been formed;
- 241.7.2 the person concerned has been formally made aware by the Local Authority that such a belief has been formed;
- There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against a decision of the Chief Executive under this Regulation 241.7 (see Regulation 108.8).
- 241.8 All affiliated clubs shall participate in and take reasonable steps to comply with the procedures of the Criminal Records Bureau and its checking services in regard to Child Protection matters and/or any subsequent procedures by the ASA including but not being limited to requests for further information.
- 241.9 All members of affiliated clubs shall participate in and comply with the procedures of the Criminal Records Bureau and its checking services in regard to Child Protection matters and/or any subsequent procedures by the ASA including but not being limited to requests for further information.
- 241.10 Any individual who fails to comply with a specific requirement of the Child Protection procedures may be suspended by the Chief Executive until such time as he has complied with any outstanding matters, provided that he has been warned of his liability to such a suspension. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against a decision of the Chief Executive under this Regulation 241.10 (see Regulation 108.9).
- 241.11 A club, body, organisation or individual suspended by the Chief Executive under this Regulation 241 shall not participate in any swimming activity organised by an affiliated club or controlled by ASA Laws and/or Regulations. He shall not act as a representative of a club or other affiliated body nor shall he be a member of any board, committee, subcommittee or council concerned with the direction or government of swimming. An individual so suspended shall not act as an official at any competition, exhibition, meeting or any other activities within the sport.
- 241.12 The suspension of any individual for a specific term decided by the Chief Executive imposed under this Regulation 241 shall not be lifted unless and until the individual has submitted to a formal risk assessment with regard to his suitability to be involved with children in the sport of swimming.
- 241.13 It shall be a condition of membership or affiliation to any Region of the ASA that:
- 241.13.1 an affiliated club adopts the ASA Child Protection Procedures; and
- 241.13.2 the members of the affiliated club comply with the Child Protection Procedures.
- 241.14 Without prejudice to the generality of Regulation 241.13 the ASA may from time to time issue guidance or directions with regard to compliance with Regulation 241.13.

CLUB RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES
ASA Regulation 281

281 Club discipline and internal dispute procedures

- 281.1 For a breach of its own rules, an affiliated club or body may:
- 281.1.1 apply sanctions to a member relating to activities wholly within its own jurisdiction up to and including suspension from any or all of them;
- 281.1.2 expel a member, provided that before doing so it informs the member of the alleged offence and gives him a reasonable opportunity to defend himself against the charge. If the alleged offence is also a breach of ASA Law or Regulations the club or body shall not deal with it but may make a complaint under the Judicial Laws and Regulations.
- 281.2 A club or body may expel from membership and/or refuse to renew the membership of any member who has been suspended according to Regulation 109 or Regulation 241 provided that any such expulsion or initial refusal shall not be lawful after the twelve months immediately following the end of the suspension.
- 281.3 Each club shall include in its rules provisions specifying the procedures to be carried out to handle internal club disputes.
- 281.4 Any such provisions shall comply with the ASA Recommended Club Constitution and the accompanying Guidance Notes.

**WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB
SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIP AND AGE GROUP CONDITIONS**

The Warrington Swimming Club Championship and Age Group Competition conditions are not part of the Constitutional Rules of the Club and are therefore published separately.

1 General Championship Conditions

- 1.1 The Swimming Championships shall take place annually at venues and on dates decided by the General Committee.
- 1.2 The Championships shall normally take place in October of each year on dates to be decided by the General Committee.
- 1.3 Any alteration to the conditions of any Championship or any other competition shall be subject to approval by the General Committee.
- 1.4 Entry fees shall be as set by the General Committee.
- 1.5 All Championships events will be held in accordance with the appropriate ASA Laws and the ASA Technical Rule of Swimming.
- 1.6 The Club Championships shall be open to all members of the Club.
- 1.7 Any competitor failing to comply with any of the conditions may be disqualified and shall forfeit any fee paid.

2 Championship Entries

- 2.1 Entries must be made on the official entry forms of the club to reach the Hon. Championship Secretary by the specified closing date, accompanied by the entry fee.
- 2.2 In the age group events the age shall be the age as at 31st December in the year of the competition.
- 2.3 In the case of entries to the Junior or the Age Group events the Parent or Guardian of the competitor must complete the official declaration of the date of birth.
- 2.4 Championship entry forms shall be made available no later than 1st July.
- 2.5 The closing date for entries shall be 8th September.
- 2.6 Late entries will not be accepted.

3. Championship Events

- 3.1 Events shall be held in the following categories
 - i Senior Championships
 - ii 16 years and under (Junior) Championships
 - iii 14 years and under competitions
 - iv 12 years and under competitions.
 - v 10 years and under competitions
- 3.2 The General Committee shall be responsible for producing the programme of events with consideration being given to the number of entries in each event as to whether heats and finals are required.
- 3.3 Senior and Junior Championships are classed as separate competitions but are swum as a combined event, if heats are involved.
- 3.4 In all events having more than six competitors, a final will be swum with the six fastest competitors from the heats contesting the final.
- 3.5 The Junior Championship shall be awarded to the Junior swimmer with the fastest recorded time in the Championship.
- 3.6 If the first three places of any category are not decided in the Final then the final placing will be based on the fastest heat times of the non-finalists.

4 Definitions

- 4.1 A Junior is one who is under 17 years of age on 31st. December in the year of the competition.

5 Trophies

- 5.1 Winners shall be entitled (subject to satisfactory guarantee to the trustees) to hold the respective trophies for the events up to one month before the next yearly competition. Upon expiration of this period or upon ceasing to be members of the Club trophies must be returned to the Championship Secretary

WARRINGTON SWIMMING CLUB TROPHIES

Trophies have been presented to the club as follows:-

- 1897 **Champion Swimming Shield**
Presented to the club by the Licensed Victuallers Association, probably by the good offices of the Ashton family who were well known members of the club and Licensee's in Warrington. Mr A Ashton won the Senior Mens Freestyle Championship of the club in 1899 and held the office of Chairman of the club from 1915 to 1941 and from 1943 to 1946. He was made a Life Member of the club in 1930 and died in 1961. Mr C Ashton was a Life Member of the club from 1924 to his death in 1970.
- 1897 **Henry Thornton Rose Bowl**
Presented to the club by Mr. Henry Thornton, Auctioneer and Accountant and a prominent member of the town.
- 1904 **Sir Gilbert Greenall Challenge Shield**
Presented to the club by Sir Gilbert Greenall Bart. who became the first Lord Daresbury in 1928. He was Vice President of the club up to his death in 1938.
- 1923 **Alderman Bolton Perpetual Trophy**
Presented to the club by Alderman Bolton in 1923 according to club minutes but has names on the trophy from 1920. Alderman Bolton was Mayor of Warrington from 1903 to 1906.
- 1925 **The Eustance Trophy**
Presented to the club by Eustance & Co Ltd. a well known company of jewellers in the town at that time.
- 1933 **Margaret Hallaway Trophy**
Presented to the club by Mrs. Margaret Hallaway, wife of the then Town Clerk. Mr Hallaway served as Town Clerk of Warrington for the period 1918 - 1939.
- 1933 **The Wardonia Perpetual Trophy** Presented to the club by Thomas Ward Ltd. a well known company of Cutlers in Warrington at that time.
- 1947 **The Rowland Lord Memorial Trophy** Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. E Lord in memory of their son Rowland, killed at sea in 1944. Rowland Lord was an outstanding swimmer in the club and winner of the Senior Mens Freestyle Championship of the club on five occasions from 1933 to 1937.
- 1949 **Mabel Briscoe Trophy**
Presented to the Club by Major and Mrs. Briscoe. Major Briscoe was a prominent member of the town.
- 1951 **1951 Festival Trophy**
Presented to the Club by Mrs V Dacey on behalf of the then Ladies Committee of the club in recognition of the Festival of Britain celebration and allocated to the Ladies 100 metres Breaststroke event.
- 1951 **1951 Festival Trophy**
Presented to the Club by Mrs V Dacey on behalf of the then Ladies Committee of the club in recognition of the Festival of Britain celebration in 1951 and allocated to the Mens 100 metres Breaststroke event.
- 1952 **Festival of Britain Trophy**
Presented to the club by the Warrington Parks and Baths Committee to mark the Festival of Britain celebration. The trophy is allocated to the Senior Mens Swimmer of the Year.
- 1952 **Queen Elizabeth II Coronation Trophy**
Presented to the club by the Warrington Parks and Baths Committee to mark the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. The trophy is allocated to the Senior Womens Swimmer of the Year.
- 1956 **Eugene Dell Trophy**
Presented to the club by the family of Eugene Dell to mark his 50 years of service to the club. Although never holding office in the Club he was a long time supporter of the activities of the Club.
- 1959 **R W Cook Challenge Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr R W Cook, a well-known Estate Agent in Warrington at that time.
- 1959 **Ada Clegg Trophy**
Presented to the club by Mrs Ada Clegg, daughter of Mr R W Cook. Allocated to the Girls 100 metres Individual Medley championship but withdrawn in 1975 due to excessive damage that could not be repaired.
- 1959 **A Clegg Trophy**
Presented to the club by Mrs Ada Clegg, daughter of Mr R W Cook. Allocated to the Senior Womens 200 metres Individual Medley championship.
1966. **Clayton Challenge Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs J G Clayton. Both Mr. and Mrs. Clayton were for many years members of the General Management Committee of the club and Mr. Geoffrey Clayton held the office of Chairman of the club in 1974 and 1975.
- 1967 **Rathmill Challenge Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs J R Rathmill. For many years Mrs. B Rathmill was a member of the then Ladies Committee and Mr. J R Rathmill is a member of the General Management Committee of the club. Mr. Rathmill held the office of Chairman of the club in 1987 and 1988 then in 1995 and 1996 and again in 2007 and 2008. He held the position of Club Secretary from 1970 to 1973, from 1975 to 1984 and in 1990 and 1991. Mr. Rathmill was elected a Life Member of the club in 1984. For a number of years he has represented the Club on the Executive Committee of Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association.
1967. **Eric B Barton Memorial Trophy**
Presented to the club by Mrs. Barton in memory of her husband Eric. Mrs. Barton served on the then Ladies Committee of the club for a number of years.
- 1968 **Williams Challenge Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. R Williams. For many years Mrs. Williams served on the then Ladies Committee and Mr. Williams was a member of the General Management Committee of the club.
- 1969 **Savage Challenge Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. Savage.
1973. **G E Massey Cup**
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. G E Massey. For a number of years Mrs. Massey served on the then Ladies Committee of the club.

- 1973 Buckley Challenge Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. F Buckley. Mrs D Buckley served on the General Management Committee of the club for many years and held the position of Chairman of the club in its Centenary year of 1979 and in 1980. Mrs. Buckley was elected a Life Member of the club in 1980.
- 1974 William Henry Ellis Memorial Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. Roy Ellis in memory of his father. Although never seeking office in the club William 'Bill' Ellis was an active member of the club over a very long period of time and was actively engaged in teaching swimming right up to his death in 1974.
- 1975 R A Clayton Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. R A Clayton. For a number of years both Mr. and Mrs. Clayton were members of the General Management Committee of the club. Mr. Alan Clayton held the office of Chairman of the club in 1976.
- 1975 A W Taylor Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. A W Taylor. Mr. Taylor was a member of the General Management Committee of the club for a number of years up to his death in 1981.
- 1979 Centenary Challenge Trophy
Presented for competition by the General Management Committee of the club to commemorate the centenary of the club in 1979 and allocated to the Girls 14 years 100 metres Freestyle.
- 1980 Jack Bayley Trophy
Presented to the club by Jack Bayley to commemorate his long association with the club, spanning a period of over 50 years, at the time of the presentation of the trophy. Winner of the club freestyle championship in 1930 and for many years a well known water polo player, Jack Bayley also served as a member of the General Management Committee of the club and as the Water Polo Secretary from 1952 to 1975. He represented the Warrington Swimming Club on the Executive Committee of the Northern Counties Amateur Swimming Association, the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and the Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association. Made a Life Member of the club in 1961 in recognition of his outstanding service he remained active in swimming right up to his death in 1991. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years 50 metres Freestyle in recognition of the many young children Jack Bayley taught to swim.

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. M Finney who were for a number of years members of the General Management Committee of the club. Mrs. S Finney held the position of Secretary of the club in 1992 and 1993. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 14 years Backstroke.
1989. M Finney Trophy
A second trophy presented to the Club by Mr. and Mrs. M Finney and allocated to the Boys 14 years Backstroke.
- 1990 Derek Flannery Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. D Flannery on his departure from Warrington to take up employment in Cambridge. Derek Flannery, a member of the club from an early age won a total of nine club championships in the period from 1978 to 1984 and enjoyed a distinguished career as a water polo player in championship winning teams at ASA, Northern Counties District, Cheshire County and Liverpool and District level. The trophy is allocated to the Mens Junior 50 metres Freestyle Championship.
- 1991 Pam Caley Trophy
Presented to the Club by Mrs Pam Caley who was for a number of years a member of the General Management Committee of the Club. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years Breaststroke.
- 1994 Pam Caley Trophy
A second trophy presented to the Club by Mrs Pam Caley who was for a number of years a member of the General Management Committee of the Club. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years Swimmer of the Year competition.
- 1994 Eaton Trophy
Presented to the Club by Mr K Eaton who has held the position of Chief Swimming Coach in the club from 1987 to 2007. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 12 years Swimmer of the Year competition.
- 1994 Coaches Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr K Eaton who was the Chief Swimming Coach to the club at that time. Mr Eaton has held the position of Chief Swimming Coach to the club since 1987. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 10 years Swimmer of the Year competition.
- 1994 Tom Hughes Memorial Trophy
Presented to the club by Mrs. D Eaton in memory of her father. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 10 years Swimmer of the Year Competition.
- 1994 Derek Musson Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr D Musson. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 10 years Freestyle Age Group Competition.
1994. Warrington Swimming Club Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. B. Chidlaw. Both Mr and Mrs Chidlaw have been members of the General

Management Committee of the club for many years.
