Constitutional Rules of Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club As at 25th November 2020

1. Name

- 1.1 The name of the Club shall be Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club, hereinafter called the Club.

2. Objectives

- 2.1 The objects of the Club shall be:-
- 2.1.1 the teaching, development and practice of:-
 - 2.1.1.1 swimming.
 - 2.1.1.2 the game of water polo.
 - 2.1.2 the promotion of championships and competitions for its members.
 - 2.1.3 where appropriate to compete at Local, County, Region, National and International level
 - 2.1.4 Raise public awareness of the sport and stimulate public opinion in favour of providing suitable accommodation and facilities.
- 2.2 In the furtherance of these objectives:
- 2.2.1 The Club is committed to treating everyone equally within the context of its activity and with due respect to the differences of individuals. It shall not apply nor endorse unlawful or unjustified discrimination, and shall act in compliance with the protections afforded by the Equality Act 2010.
 - 2.2.2 The Club shall implement the Swim England Equality policy. (as may be amended from time to time)
 - 2.2.3. The Club will comply with the Data Protection Act 2018 as it may be modified from time to time.
 - 2.2.4 All Swim England affiliated clubs and organisations must adopt the Wavepower document as it may be modified from time to time.
- 2.3 The Club shall be affiliated to the Swim England North West Region and to the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and shall adopt and conform to the rules and regulations of those Associations and to such other bodies as the Club may determine from time to time.
- 2.4 The business and affairs of the Club shall at all times be conducted in accordance with the Laws, Regulations and Technical Rules of Swim England and in particular:
- 2.4.1 All competing members shall be eligible competitors as defined in Swim England Regulations

- 2.4.2 the Club shall in accordance with Swim England Laws and Regulations adopt the Swim England's Child Safeguarding and Procedures (Wavepower) and shall recognise that the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility and that all children and young people have a right to have fun, be safe and be protected from harm.
- 2.4.3 members of the Club shall in accordance with Swim England Laws and Regulations comply with the Swim England Child Safeguarding Policy, and Procedures ('Wavepower').
- 2.5 By virtue of the affiliation of the Club to Swim England North West Region the Club and all members of the Club acknowledge that they are subject to the laws, regulations, rules and constitutions of:
 - 2.5.1 Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and
 - 2.5.2 Swim England North West Region and
 - 2.5.3 Swim England; to include the Swim England/IoS Code of Ethics;
 - 2.5.4 British Swimming (to include in particular the Doping Control Rules and Protocols and the judicial Code);
 - 2.5.5 FINA, the world governing body for the sport of swimming in all its disciplines (together "the Governing Body Rules")
- 2.6 In the event that there shall be any conflict between any rule or by-law of the Club and any of the Governing Body Rules then the relevant Governing Body Rule shall prevail

3 Membership

- 3.1 The total membership of the Club shall not normally be limited. If however the Management Committee considers that there is a good reason to impose any limit from time to time then the Management Committee shall put forward appropriate proposals for consideration at a General Meeting of the Club. The members shall have the right to impose and remove from time to time any limits on total membership, or on any category of membership, of the Club.
- 3.2 All persons who assist in any way with the Club's activities shall become members of the Club and hence of Swim England and the relevant Swim England membership fee shall be paid. Assisting with the Club's activities shall include, but not be restricted to, administrators, Associate members, voluntary instructors, teachers and coaches, Committee members, helpers, Honorary members, Life members, Officers, Patrons, Presidents, technical and non-technical officials, temporary members, Vice Presidents and verifiers or tutors of the Swim England's educational certificates.
- 3.3 Paid instructors, teachers and coaches who are not members of the Club

must be members of a body which accepts that its members are bound by the Swim England's Code of Ethics, Swim England's Regulations relating to 'Wavepower' and those parts of the Judicial Regulations and procedures necessary for their implementation and whilst engaged in activities under the jurisdiction of Swim England shall be subject to all the constraints and privileges of the Judicial Regulations.

- 3.4 Any person who wishes to become a member of the Club must submit a signed application form to the Secretary. In the case of a junior member the application must be signed by the member's parent or guardian. Election to membership shall be determined by the Management Committee but other person(s) authorised by the Committee may make recommendation as to the applicants' acceptability.
- 3.5 The Management Committee shall be required to give reasons for the refusal of any application for membership. Any person refused membership may seek a review of this decision before a Review Panel appointed by the Management Committee comprised of not less than three members, who may or may not be members of the Management Committee. The Review Panel shall [wherever practicable] include one independent member nominated by the Swim England North West Region. The person refused membership shall be entitled to make representations to the Review Panel. The procedures for review shall be at the discretion of the Review Panel whose decision shall be final and binding.
- 3.6 In its consideration of applications for membership, the Club shall not act in a discriminatory manner and in particular, shall adhere to the Equality Act 2010 (as may be amended). Accordingly, the Club shall not refuse an application for membership on the basis of a Protected Characteristic within the Act, such as discriminatory grounds, whether in relation to ethnic origin, age, sex, religion, disability, political persuasion or sexual orientation such as disability; gender or gender identity; pregnancy; race; religion or belief; or sexual orientation. Neither may refusal be made on the grounds of political persuasion.
- 3.7 The Club may refuse membership only for good and sufficient cause, such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club or the sport into disrepute or in the case of an athlete, being unable to achieve the entry standard as laid down and provided by the Club to the applicant for membership.
- 3.8 All memberships shall be renewed on an annual basis through the process of re-application not later than 1st January.
- 3.9 The membership of the Club shall consist of the following categories:-
 - 3.9.1 Senior Members, who shall be not less than 18 years of age shall be

eligible to stand for election for office and for membership of the committee, to attend and vote at General Meetings of the membership and to submit nominations, proposals and resolutions to a general meeting of the membership.,

- 3.9.2 Junior Members, who shall be less than 18 years of age, shall not be allowed to hold office, attend meetings of the Committee unless by invitation of the Committee to vote at Committee or General Meetings or submit nominations, proposals or resolutions for consideration at a general meeting of the membership and shall have at least one parent or guardian who shall be an Associate Member of the Club.
- 3.9.3 Honorary Members, who shall be not less than 18 years of age, who shall be elected by the Management Committee for such a period as they think fit. Honorary Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership except that they shall not be entitled to make nominations for office, to submit proposals and resolutions for consideration at a general meeting of the membership, to vote at general meetings of the membership or serve as officers or on the Management Committee unless any such person shall have retained in addition his ordinary membership of the Club. Such Honorary Members must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.4 Life Members, who shall be not less than 18 years of age who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting on a recommendation made by the Management Committee in recognition of outstanding services rendered to the Club. Life members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership except that they shall not be entitled to make nominations for office, to submit proposals and resolutions for consideration at a General Meeting of the membership, or serve as officers or on the Management Committee unless any such person shall have retained in addition their ordinary membership of the Club. Such Life Members must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.5 Once created, Life Membership or Honorary may only be removed at an Annual General Meeting of the Club, when it shall be properly proposed in accordance with these Rules.
 - 3.9.5.1 A minimum of 21 days in advance of the Annual General Meeting, the Secretary shall write or make contact electronically with all holders of life membership or honorary membership drawing the proposal to his/her/their attention and inviting him/her/them to attend the Annual General Meeting.
 - 3.9.5.2 Where the affected holder or holders of Life membership or Honorary membership do not attend or are unable to attend the Annual General Meeting, the Chairman may

allow the matter (in so far as it relates to the absent person(s)) to proceed directly to vote, which shall be by a secret ballot.

- 3.9.6 Associate Members, who shall be not less than 18 years of age, who shall be a parent or guardian of a junior member or elected by the Management Committee in recognition of support or services rendered to the Club. Associate Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership including the right to make nominations for office and for the committee, to submit propositions and resolutions for consideration at any general meeting of the membership, to attend and vote at General Meetings of the membership, to hold office and be elected to the Management or other Committees and must be included in the Club's annual return as to membership.
- 3.9.7 Temporary Members, who are individuals granted temporary membership by the Swim England by virtue of their participation in specific event(s) organised by the Club in conjunction with a Club, body, association or organisation under the provision of Swim England—Regulation on temporary membership. Temporary Members shall not be entitled to make proposals and resolutions, to vote at meetings and serve as officers or on the Committee.

4 Membership and Other Fees

- 4.1 The annual membership fee and any training or session fees as applicable shall be determined from time to time by the Management Committee and the Management Committee shall in so doing make special provision for different classes of membership,
- 4.2 The annual subscription or membership fee shall be due on joining the Club and thereafter on the 1st January each year.
- 4.3 Any member whose annual membership fee to the Club has not been paid by the date falling 30 days after the due date may be suspended by the Management Committee from some or all Club activities from a date to be determined by the Management Committee and until such payment is made
- 4.4 The Management Committee shall, from time to time, have the power to determine the annual membership fee and other fees. The Management Committee shall also have the power to decide on the method(s) of payment for the membership and any other fees. This shall include the power to make such increase in the subscription as shall, where the Club pays the individual Swim England Membership Fees to Swim England on behalf of members, be consequential upon an increase in individual Swim England membership fees. Any increase in subscriptions shall be advised to the members in writing or by email with the reasons for any increase to be reported to the

members at the next Annual General Meeting.

- 4.5 The Management Committee shall have the power in special circumstances to remit the whole or part of the Swim England or Club fees to address issues of social inclusion.

5 Resignation

- 5.1 A member wishing to resign membership of the Club must give to the Secretary a written or electronic notice of his/her resignation. A member's resignation shall only take effect when agreed by the Management Committee and there is no outstanding financial commitment or disciplinary action outstanding against the individual and this Rule 5.1 has been complied with.
- 5.2 A member who resigns from membership of the Club in accordance with Rule 5.1 above shall not be entitled to have any part of the annual membership fee or any other fees returned and must return any Club or external body's trophy or trophies or equipment held forthwith.
- 5.3 Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 5.1 above a member whose membership or subscription fee is more than two months in arrears from the due date shall be deemed to have resigned. Where the membership of a member shall be terminated in this way he/she shall be informed in writing that he/she is no longer a member of the Club by a notice handed to him/her or sent by post to his/her last known address.
- 5.4 Swim England shall be informed should a member resign from the Club with financial obligations or in possession of goods or equipment belonging to the Club.

6 Expulsion and other Disciplinary Action

- 6.1 The Management Committee shall have the power to expel a member when, in its opinion, it would not be in the interests of the Club for him/her to remain a member. The Club in exercising this power shall comply with the provisions of Rules 6.3 and 6.4 below
- 6.2 Upon expulsion the former member shall not be entitled to have any part of the annual membership fee or any other fees refunded and must return any Club or external body's trophy or trophies or equipment held forthwith.
- 6.3 The Club shall adopt and comply with the requirements and procedures of the relevant Swim England Judicial Regulations for handling Internal Club Disputes as the same may be revised from time to time. A copy of the

relevant Regulations and Procedures are given as an Annex to these constitutional rules.

- 6.4 A member may not be expelled or, subject to Rule 6.5 below, be made the subject of any other penalty unless the Dispute Panel hearing the dispute shall, by a two-thirds majority, vote in favour of the expulsion or any other penalty imposed upon the member.
- 6.5 The Officers of the Club, or any other person to whom the Management Committee shall delegate this power, may temporarily suspend or exclude a member from particular training sessions and/or wider Club activities, when in their opinion, such action is in the interests of the Club. Where such disciplinary action is taken the incident or matter will thereafter be dealt with in accordance with the appropriate Judicial Regulations.
- 6.6 The Club Officials in charge of a particular event or activity shall be responsible for the discipline. If further action is required this shall be referred to the Internal Club Dispute procedure as laid down in Swim England Judicial Laws and Regulations.

7 Management Committee

- 7.1 The Management Committee shall consist of:-
 - 7.1.1 The Executive members of the Committee who shall be:-
 - 7.1.1.1 The Chairman
 - 7.1.1.2 The Vice Chairman
 - 7.1.1.3 The Treasurer
 - 7.1.1.4 The Secretary
 - 7.1.2 Eight other elected members
 - 7.1.3 The appointed members who shall be members of the committee:-
 - 7.1.3.1 The Chief Swimming Coach.
 - 7.1.3.2 The Chief Water Polo Coach
- 7.2 All the members of the Management Committee shall be members of the Club and must be not less than 18 years of age though the Management Committee may allow younger member(s) to attend their meetings by invitation of the Committee without the power to vote.
- 7.3 The Committee shall appoint as and when required a member of the Club
 - 7.3.1 as Welfare Officer who must be a member of the Club and not less than 18 years of age, who should have an appropriate background and who is required to undertake appropriate training in accordance with "Wavepower". The Welfare Officer shall not be a member of the teaching and coaching staff or the Team Manager or a member of the family of an officer, committee member, the teaching and

coaching staff or the Team Manager. The Welfare Officer shall not be a member of the committee but will have a right to attend Committee meetings without a power to vote, shall not be counted as part of the quorum and shall report to the Committee on all aspects of welfare concerning members of the Club.

7.3.2 As the Chief Swimming Coach who must be a member of the Club and not less than 18 years of age and should have an appropriate background. The Chief Swimming Coach shall be a member of the Committee without the power to vote and shall not be counted as part of the quorum.

7.3.3 As the Chief Water Polo Coach who must be a member of the Club and not less than 18 years of age and should have an appropriate background. The Chief Water Polo Coach shall be a member of the Committee without the power to vote and shall not be counted as part of the quorum.

7.3.4 As the Data Control Officer who must be the member of the club and not less than 18 years of age. The Data Control Officer shall be responsible for any membership data processing in accordance with the General Data Processing Regulations (GDPR). The Data Control Officer shall not be member of the committee.

7.4 The members of the Management Committee shall be elected or appointed as follows:

7.4.1 The elected Committee members with the exception of the Chairman and the Vice Chairman shall be proposed, seconded and elected by ballot at an Annual General Meeting.

7.4.1.1 Each member shall be elected for a four year term of office

7.4.1.2 The two longest serving members shall retire each year.

7.4.1.3 Each member shall take office from when his election has been made at an Annual General Meeting and shall remain in office until his successor is appointed and will take office when the Chairman has closed the meeting

7.4.1.4 be eligible for re-election for one further four year term of office only

7.4.1.5 not be eligible for re-election after serving two terms in office until an absence of one four year term of office has elapsed

7.4.2 The Chairman shall be proposed, by the Management Committee and elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting as and when required and shall hold office for a period not exceeding two years and will take office when the Chairman has closed the meeting. The retiring chairman shall be eligible for re-election for not more than one further consecutive period of two years but shall be eligible for re-election at some future date.

7.4.3 The Vice Chairman shall be proposed by the Management

Committee and elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting as and when required and shall hold office for a period of one year and will take office when the Chairman has closed the meeting. A retiring Vice Chairman shall be eligible for re-election at some future date.

- 7.4.4 The appointed members shall be appointed by the committee as and when required in accordance with Constitutional Rule 7.3
- 7.4.5 Any vacancy occurring by resignation or otherwise in any elected position previously filled at the Annual General Meeting may be filled by the Management Committee and shall serve until the next Annual General meeting. Retiring members of the Management Committee shall be eligible for re-election.
- 7.5 In the event of any member of the Management Committee, with the exception of the appointed members, not attending four consecutive committee meetings, or attending less than half the number of meetings of the Committee with or without an apology it shall be considered equivalent to their resignation and the committee shall proceed to fill the vacancy, unless the committee are satisfied that such absence is unavoidable, the Committee has been notified of the same and has given approval for the period of absence.
- 7.6 Management Committee meetings shall be held not less than once a month with the exception of August save where the Management Committee itself shall by a simple majority resolve not to meet, but there shall be not less than six meetings of the Management Committee per year. The Chairman and the Secretary shall have discretion to call further meetings of the Management Committee if they consider it to be in the interests of the Club. The Secretary shall give all the members of the Management Committee not less than seven days notice of a meeting in writing or by electronic means.
- 7.7 Decisions of the Management Committee shall be made by a simple majority of those elected members eligible to attend and vote and in the event of an equality of votes the Chairman, or the acting Chairman of that meeting, shall have a casting or additional vote.
- 7.8 The Secretary, or in the absence of the Secretary a member of the Committee, shall take the minutes of the meeting.
- 7.9 The quorum for a Management Committee meeting shall be such numbers as shall represent not less than a simple majority of the Management Committee members entitled to attend and vote, to include not less than one Officer. In the event that a quorum is not present within thirty minutes of the published start time, a meeting shall stand adjourned to the time and date falling seven days after the date of the meeting, or such other date and time as the Chairman may determine but shall be reconvened on a date within

one month of the original date and a minimum of 7 days advance notice given to the members of the rescheduled date, time and venue. At this meeting, the same agenda as originally issued shall be used. If a quorum is not present at the adjourned meeting then those Management Committee members attending may act for the purpose of calling a Special General Meeting of the members, to which the provisions as to minimum notice contained in Rule 11.1 and Rule 11.2 shall not apply.

- 7.10 The Chairman shall take the chair at all meetings of the Management Committee. In the absence of the Chairman the Vice Chairman shall take the chair. If the Vice Chairman is not available or is unwilling to take the chair the Management Committee, from among its membership, shall select an acting Chairman for the meeting.
- 7.11 In addition to the members so elected or appointed the Management Committee may co-opt up to two further senior members of the Club who shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting. Co-opted members shall not be entitled to vote at the meetings of the Management Committee and shall not be counted in establishing whether a quorum is present. Co-opted members shall not be less than 18 years of age.
- 7.12 The Management Committee may from time to time appoint from among the senior membership of the Club, or otherwise, such sub-committees or working groups as it may consider necessary and to remove, in whole or in part, or vary the terms of reference of such sub-committees or working groups and may delegate to them such of the powers and duties of the Management Committee as the Management Committee may determine. All sub-committees and working groups shall periodically report their proceedings to the Management Committee and shall conduct their business in accordance with the directions of the Management Committee.
- 7.13 The Management Committee shall be responsible for the management of the Club and shall have the sole right of appointing and determining the terms and conditions of service of employees and voluntary helpers of the Club. The Management Committee shall have power to enter into contracts for the purposes of the Club on behalf of all the members of the Club.
- 7.14 The members of the Management Committee shall be entitled to an indemnity out of the assets of the Club for all expenses and other liabilities properly incurred by them in the management of the affairs of the Club.
- 7.15 The Management Committee shall maintain an Accident Book in which all accidents to Club members at aquatic related activities shall be recorded. Details of such accidents shall be reported to the Swim England Membership Department. The Club shall make an annual return to Swim England

Membership Department indicating whether or not an entry has been made in the prescribed form, which is to be found on the membership renewal form.

- 7.16 The Management Committee shall have the power to make regulations, create by-laws, see also Rule 13.1, and to settle disputed points not otherwise provided for in this Constitution.
- 7.17 The Management Committee shall ensure that the financial records and minutes of meetings are retained for a period of at least 6 years.
- 7.18 At the first Management Committee meeting following the Annual General meeting the Management Committee shall appoint the delegates to attend the Council meetings of the North West Region, the County Association and such other bodies and associations to which the Club is affiliated, as required.

8 Officers

- 8.1 The Officers of the Club shall be the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, the Secretary and the Treasurer.
- 8.2 The Officers of the Club shall be elected in accordance with Rule 7.4.

9 Annual General Meeting

- 9.1 The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held each year on a date in November. The Management Committee shall fix the date, time and venue of the Annual General Meeting.
- 9.2 Only in the event of exceptional circumstances shall the Annual General Meeting be postponed by the Management Committee once the date, time and venue has been fixed and advised to members. A postponed Annual General Meeting shall be reconvened on a date within six months of the original date and a minimum of 14 days advance notice given to the members of the rescheduled date, time and venue. At this meeting, the same agenda as originally issued shall be used.
- 9.3 In any event no more than 20 months shall elapse between any two consecutive Annual General Meetings.
- 9.4 The purpose of the Annual General Meeting is to transact the following business:
 - 9.4.1 to receive and comment on the Management Committee report of the activities of the Club during the previous year, which shall normally include the reports of the Chairman, the Secretary, the

Chief Swimming Coach, the Chief Water Polo Coach, the Club delegates and the reports of any subcommittee or working group as decided by the Management Committee

9.4.2 to receive and consider the accounts of the Club for the last previous financial year, the report on the accounts of the independent examiner and the Treasurer's report as to the financial position of the Club;

9.4.3 to remove and elect the independent financial examiner, who must not be a member of the Committee or a member of the family of a member of the Committee;

9.4.4 to elect, as and when required, the Officers and other members of the Management Committee

9.4.4.1 The Chairman, who shall:

9.4.4.1.1 be the retiring Vice Chairman unless his resignation or death or a decision of the Management Committee to nominate another person on a resolution passed by four fifths of those present and voting, prevents it.

9.4.4.1.2 be subject to removal from office at any time provided that three quarters of the members of the Management Committee are in favour

9.4.4.2 The Vice Chairman, who shall:

9.4.4.2.1 in the first year of office of a new Chairman normally be the Immediate Past Chairman.

9.4.4.2.2 If the Immediate Past Chairman declines the nomination or is unable to stand a new nomination shall be made by the Management Committee

9.4.4.2.3 in the second year of office of the Chairman be a new nomination made by the Management Committee

9.4.5 to decide on the election or removal from office of the Life Members or the Honorary Members.

9.4.6 to decide on any other resolution, which may be duly submitted in accordance with Rule 9.6.

9.5 With the exception of the position of Chairman and Vice Chairman all nominations for the election of members to any office, named position or for membership of the Management Committee, shall be made in writing or by electronic means by the proposer and seconder to the Secretary not later than 21 days prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting or of a Special General Meeting. The nomination form shall indicate the willingness of the nominee to stand for election and must contain the signatures of the proposer and the seconder.

9.6 Notice of any resolutions, proposals or submissions to be considered at a General Meeting, duly proposed and seconded shall be given in writing or by electronic means to the Secretary not later than 21 days prior to the date of the meeting.

10 Special General Meeting

10.1 A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the Management Committee.

10.2 The Secretary shall notify the Senior Members of the arrangements for holding a Special General Meeting within twenty one days of receiving a written or electronic request for a Special Meeting to be held signed by not less than 20 members entitled to attend and vote at a General Meeting stating the purposes for which the meeting is required and the resolutions proposed. The meeting shall be held within two months of the receipt of the request to hold the meeting. No business shall be discussed at such a meeting other than that prescribed by the Management Committee or that stated in the request, as the case may be.

10.3 A Special General Meeting shall be called by the Secretary in response to a resolution to that effect passed at the Annual General meeting or at any other Special General meeting.

10.4 Only in the event of exceptional circumstances shall a Special General Meeting be postponed by the Committee once the date, time and venue has been fixed and advised to the members. A postponed Special General Meeting shall be reconvened on a date within three months of the original date and a minimum of 7 days advance notice given to the members of the rescheduled date, time and venue. At this meeting, the same agenda as originally issued shall be used.

11 Procedure at the Annual and Special General Meetings

11.1 The Secretary shall personally be responsible for:-

11.1.1 making available to each Senior Member a written or electronic notice of the date, time and venue of the Annual General Meeting together with the closing date for the receipt of any resolutions, proposals, nominations or reports to be considered thereat not less than 28 days before the date of the meeting

11.1.2 displaying the Notice of the Meeting on the Club Notice Board where one exists.

11.2 The Secretary shall personally be responsible for making available to each Senior Member

- 11.2.1 a written or electronic agenda for a General Meeting together with the resolutions to be proposed thereat at least fourteen days before the meeting
 - 11.2.2 in the case of the Annual General Meeting a copy of the reports to be considered, a list of nominees for the Committee posts and other positions and a copy of the examined accounts.
- 11.3 The quorum for the Annual and Special General Meetings shall be ten members entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting, which must include at least one officer.
- 11.4 Having called a General Meeting, it may only proceed to business if the correct quorum of members is present within 30 minutes after the time fixed for the meeting; otherwise, the meeting if convened at the requisition of the members shall be dissolved; if convened by the direction of the Committee it shall be adjourned to the same time in the following week save that the adjourned meeting may proceed to business whatever the number of members present.
- 11.5 If the meeting commences but is adjourned for want of time (or other good reason); the members present at the meeting will be notified there and then of the adjourned date if practicable. If not and the matter is adjourned for more than 14 days all members shall receive 7 days notice in writing or by electronic means of the adjourned meeting; otherwise only those who attend the original meeting will be notified of the date.
- 11.6 Any dissolved or adjourned meeting must be re-convened and business completed within two months of the adjournment.
- 11.7 The procedure at the AGM or Special General Meeting shall be as follows:
- 11.7.1 The Chairman shall take the chair at all General Meetings of the Club. If the Chairman is not available or declines to act as Chairman the Vice Chairman (if one has been appointed) shall be invited to take the chair. If the Vice Chairman is not available or declines to act as Chairman a member appointed by the Committee, shall take the chair.
 - 11.7.2 Each member present who is entitled to attend and vote shall have one vote and resolutions shall be passed by a simple majority.
 - 11.7.3 In the event of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting or additional vote.
 - 11.7.4 Proposals and resolutions to be considered at a General Meeting shall be submitted in accordance with Rule 9.6.
 - 11.7.5 Any Senior Member who is not excluded under the conditions of Rule 3.9.3 (Honorary Members), Rule 3.9.4 (Life Members) and Rule 3.9.7 (Temporary Members) shall be entitled to attend, to be

heard and to vote on all matters.

11.7.6 Members who are excluded under the conditions of Rule 3.9.3, Rule 3.9.4 or Rule 3.9.7 may be heard by invitation of the Chairman only. Members who have not reached their 18th birthday shall be entitled to be heard by invitation of the Chairman only on those matters determined by the Chairman as matters concerning juniors, such as the election of Club captains.

11.8 The Secretary, or in his/her absence a member of the Management Committee, shall take minutes at the Annual and Special General Meetings.

11.9 The Chairman shall at all General Meetings have unlimited authority upon every question of order and shall be, for the purpose of such meeting, the sole interpreter of the Rules of the Club.

12 Alteration of the Rules and other Resolutions

12.1 The Rules may be altered by resolution at an Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose provided that the resolution is carried by a majority of at least two-thirds of members present and entitled to vote at the General Meeting.

12.2 The Annual or a General meeting shall consider and decide only the principle and intention of the proposal. The Management Committee shall draft the wording of the changes to implement the principles and intentions approved by the meeting or shall delegate the task to an individual or group of individuals appointed by the Management Committee.

12.3 No amendment(s) to the Rules shall become effective until such amendment(s) shall have been submitted to and validated by such person as is authorised to do so by the Swim England North West Region or at a later date decided by the meeting.

12.4 Each proposal to change a Constitutional Rule and/or amendment to it shall be proposed and seconded separately and shall be open to discussion by any member entitled to attend and vote at a General meeting with or without prior indication of intent.

12.5 Any Senior members who are not excluded under the conditions of Rule 3.9.3 or Rule 3.9.6 shall be entitled to put any proposal, resolution or submission for consideration at any General Meeting provided the proposal, resolution or submission in writing or by electronic means duly proposed and seconded shall have been received by the Secretary of the Club not later than 21 days before the date of the meeting in the case of the Annual General Meeting or a Special General Meeting and thereafter the Secretary shall

supply a copy of the proposal, resolution or submission to the members in the manner provided in Rule 11.1 and Rule 11.2.

13 By-Laws and Standing Orders

- 13.1 The Management Committee shall have power to make, repeal and amend such by-laws and standing orders as they may from time to time consider necessary for the well being of the Club which by-laws and standing orders, repeals and amendments shall have effect until set aside by the Management Committee or at a General Meeting.

14 Finance

- 14.1 All moneys payable to the Club shall be received by the Treasurer and deposited in a bank account in the name of the Club. No sum above £200 shall be paid from that account except by cheque or by electronic means or online and sanctioned by two of the three authorised individuals who shall be the Treasurer and two other Management Committee members as decided by the Management Committee. Any moneys not required for immediate use may be invested as the Management Committee in its discretion think fit.
- 14.2 The income and property of the Club shall be applied only in furtherance of the objects of the Club and no part thereof shall be paid by way of bonus, dividend or profit to any members of the Club, save as set out in Rule 19.3.
- 14.3 The Management Committee shall have power to authorise the payment of remuneration and expenses to any officer, member or employee of the Club and to any other person or persons for services rendered to the Club.
- 14.4 The Treasurer shall record the financial transactions of the Club in such a manner as the Management Committee thinks fit.
- 14.5 The financial year of the Club shall be the period commencing on 1st September and ending on 31st August. Any change to the financial year shall require the approval of the members in a General Meeting.
- 14.6 The Committee shall retain all financial records relating to the Club and copies of Minutes of all meetings for a minimum period of six years.
- 14.7 The Committee shall be responsible for ensuring that the Accounts of the Club for each financial year be examined by an independent examiner to be appointed by the members in a General Meeting.

15 Borrowing

- 15.1 The Management Committee may borrow money on behalf of the Club for the purposes of the Club from time to time at their own discretion, up to the limits on borrowing as may be laid down from time to time by a General Meeting, for the general upkeep of the Club or with the prior approval of a General Meeting for any other expenditure, additions or improvements.
- 15.2 When so borrowing the Management Committee shall have power to raise in any way any sum or sums of money and to raise and secure the repayment of any sums or sums of money in such manner or on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, and in particular by mortgage of or charge upon or by the issues of debentures charged upon all or any part of the property of the Club.
- 15.3 The Management Committee shall have no power to pledge the personal liability of any member of the Club for the repayment of any sums so borrowed.

16 Property

- 16.1 The property of the Club, other than cash at the bank, shall be vested in not more than four Custodians. They shall deal with the property as directed by resolution of the Committee and entry in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence of such a resolution.
- 16.2 The Custodians shall be elected at a General Meeting of the Club and shall hold office until death or resignation unless removed by a resolution passed at a General Meeting.
- 16.3 The Custodians shall be entitled to an indemnity out of the assets of the Club for all expenses and other liabilities properly incurred by them in the discharge of their duties.

17 Competitions

- 17.1 The rules governing the Club swimming championships are deemed not to be part of the Constitutional Rules of the Club.
- 17.2 All trophies of the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club shall be considered perpetual unless the donor at the time of making the presentation to the Club specifies otherwise.

18 Club Awards

- 18.1 The Club shall award Certificates for services to the Club in two categories as follows:
- 18.1.1 A Certificate of Achievement
 - 18.1.2 A Certificate of Merit
- 18.2 The Certificate shall be awarded at the discretion of the Management Committee from recommendations or nominations received by the Secretary, in writing, at any time, from any source.
- 18.3 Certificate of Achievement
A Certificate of Achievement shall be awarded
- 18.3.1 To a person elected as a Life Member of the Club
 - 18.3.2 To an individual, group or team, on the recommendation of the Committee or the Annual General Meeting, in recognition of a special performance in competition or any other action deserving of recognition by a member of the Club.
 - 18.3.3 For a substantial contribution to the promotion of any discipline at National, Region or County level for and within the Club.
- 18.4 Certificate of Merit
A Certificate of Merit shall be awarded:
- 18.4.1 To a retiring Chairman
 - 18.4.2 To an Officer, Committee member or post holder of the Club with a minimum of five years service
 - 18.4.3 To any sponsor or supporter who provided significant material benefit to the Club at any time.

19 Dissolution

- 19.1 A resolution to dissolve the Club shall only be considered at a General Meeting and shall be carried by a majority of at least three - quarters of the members present and entitled to vote. A specific date for the dissolution shall be included in the resolution.
- 19.2 The dissolution shall take effect from the date specified in the resolution and the members of the Management Committee shall be responsible for the winding-up of the assets and liabilities of the Club.
- 19.3 Any assets remaining after the discharge of the debts and liabilities of the Club shall be given to a non-profit making organisation having aims and objectives similar to those of the Club for the furtherance of such aims and objectives as nominated by the last Management Committee.

20 Acknowledgments

20.1 The Members acknowledge that these Rules constitute a legally binding contract to regulate the relationship of the members with each other and the Club.

The following statement needs to appear on Club membership forms and is to be signed by the member and must also be countersigned by the parent, or a person having parental responsibility for the member, if under 18 years of age:

I acknowledge receipt of the rules of the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club and confirm my understanding and acceptance that such rules, as amended from time to time, shall govern my membership of the Club. I further acknowledge and accept the responsibilities of membership upon members as set out in these rules.

Data Protection Consent Statement:

It shall be a condition of membership that all members shall be subject to and bound by any Swim England Law, Rule, Regulation or Condition, in addition to complying with the Equality Policy, the Child Safeguarding Regulations and the Data Protection Act 2018 which may from time to time apply to them

Annex 1

CODE OF ETHICS

Terms of Reference

The content of this Code of Ethics applies to all those involved within the sports of swimming, diving, water polo, open water swimming and artistic swimming. The Code of Ethics should be read in conjunction with the Codes of Conduct contained in Swim England's Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures (Wavepower).

Code of Ethics

All individuals within the Swim England aquatic disciplines will at all times:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person, be they adult or child, treating everyone equally within the context of the sport.
- Respect the spirit of the sport adhering to the rules and laws in and out of the pool, incorporating the concept of friendship and respect for others.
- Promote the positive aspects of the sport and never condone the use of inappropriate or abusive language, inappropriate relationships, bullying, harassment, discrimination or physical violence.
- Accept responsibility for their own behaviour and encourage and guide all Swim England members and parents of junior members to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and conduct.
- Ensure all concerns of a child safeguarding nature are referred in accordance with Wavepower.
- Conduct themselves in a manner that takes all reasonable measures to protect their own safety and the safety of others.
- Promote the reputation of the sport and never behave or encourage or condone others to behave in a manner that is liable to bring the sport into disrepute.
- Adhere to Wavepower.
- Adhere to the Codes of Conduct contained in Wavepower.
- Adhere to Swim England's Equality Policy
- Adhere to the Rules and Regulations of Swim England.
- Adhere to the British Swimming Anti-Doping Rules.

Annex 2

GUIDELINES FOR HANDLING INTERNAL CLUB DISPUTES

1 Introduction

The purpose of these notes is to give Clubs guidance in the handling of internal Club disputes. With the introduction of the Code of Ethics and the increased risk of litigation it is important that internal disputes are handled correctly from the outset. Whilst most Clubs do from time to time have disputes between Committee members, parents and swimmers these can usually be resolved amicably between the individuals concerned. Occasionally it is also necessary to discipline swimmers for minor incidents of misbehaviour and this can also be done fairly by the Coach/Team Manager.

Sometimes a more serious dispute arises in a Club and because such a situation does not occur frequently Clubs are unsure how to handle the matter. This can lead to the dispute becoming more serious with recourse to the Judicial procedures becoming necessary.

These guidelines do not apply to paid employees of a Club. If a Club is in dispute with a paid employee then the employment contract and employment law needs to be considered. Specialist legal advice may have to be sought.

2 General Principles

Swim England Judicial Regulations define Protests and Complaints and it should first be decided whether the matter is a Protest or a Complaint. A Protest can be dealt with by a Club provided they are the Promoter of the Competition to which the Protest relates. A Complaint cannot be dealt with by a Club. However, it is often possible to resolve a dispute within a Club without the matter becoming a formal Complaint. If either party is dissatisfied with a decision reached in an internal Club dispute then they still have the option to make a formal Complaint to the Swim England Judicial Administrator.

It must be noted that a Club only has the power to legislate for a breach of its own rules and can only suspend a swimmer from its own Club activities. A Club has not power to handle a dispute relating to a member of another Club nor deal with an offence against Swim England Law.

The key principle to be followed is that Swim England laws and regulations conform to the law of the land in so much that an individual accused of an alleged offence is innocent until proven guilty and he/she must have reasonable opportunity to present a defence and have his/her views heard.

In these notes reference is made to the term „dispute“ to avoid confusion with the term „Complaint“ used in formal Swim England Judicial terms. The term Club could also refer to a League or County Association.

It is assumed for the purpose of these notes that the dispute is between the Club and one or more of its members. It is most important that the same people in the Club do not become both the prosecutor (or defender) and the judge. If the Committee or its officers are either the prosecutor or defender or involved in the dispute then they must find other members not connected with the matter to hear the evidence from both parties to the dispute.

There are occasions when a problem arises in a Club, for example fighting between members in a training session, where immediate action is required such as a temporary suspension or exclusion from a training session or from wider Club activities. Coaches and officers should always be given the power to invoke a temporary suspension. A report should then be made, immediately, to the Club officers who should follow the procedures in the relevant section of the rules.

3 Procedures

On receipt of the dispute every effort should be made to resolve the matter by informal discussion. In difficult cases the Chairman of the relevant Panel is empowered to appoint an independent arbitrator to assist in achieving a settlement. If this fails or it is clearly necessary to discipline a member, the Club should set up a panel to deal with the matter.

The panel should consist of three persons, one to act as Chairman. A Secretary may also be needed. The panel will need to consist of people not involved in the dispute and the Club may want to ask individuals from outside the Club to sit on the panel. The full Club Committee could of course hear the dispute but given the number of people on a Committee this could be seen as intimidating and it is usually preferable to have a smaller number of people to hear a disciplinary matter, hence the recommendation to set up a panel of three persons.

The Chairman must notify both parties of the date, time and place of the hearing and the names of the panel members. Both parties need to be given copies of all the papers and every effort should be made to hold the hearing within 14 days of the receipt of the dispute.

If either party is under 18 years of age they must be advised of their right to be accompanied by a parent (or other person with a parental responsibility for them) or coach to help them present their case.

Both parties should be allowed to bring witnesses.

The hearing should be as informal as possible but needs to be controlled. Points to note;

- (a) The complainant will present evidence first and the accused will have the right of reply.
- (b) Both parties to the dispute are able to call witnesses, the complainant going first and each party should be allowed to question the other party's witnesses.
- (c) Witnesses must wait outside the hearing room until they are called. After questioning they may wait in the hearing room, taking no further part in the proceedings.
- (d) The Chairman or Secretary will make notes of the hearing and the panel will make every effort to announce their decision verbally to all the parties without delay followed by written confirmation to reach all parties within five days.

4 Powers of the Clubs

The powers of Clubs regarding the disciplinary action they can apply must not exceed those in Swim England Judicial Laws which can result in full suspension from Club activities for whatever period the panel shall decide or in expulsion. The panel if it wishes can impose a lesser penalty such as a written or verbal reprimand.

If either party to the dispute is dissatisfied with the outcome they are still entitled to make a Complaint to the Judicial Administrator at Swim England Head Office, Loughborough.

5 Further Information

Additional guidance can be obtained from the Swim England Handbook Judicial Regulations. The Sports Council have also issued a booklet "Getting it Right" a Guide to Sports Ethics and Disciplinary Procedures.

6 Conclusions

The key message when dealing with disputes is to ensure:

- (a) All parties are treated fairly;
- (b) The complainant has the opportunity to present the case; and
- (c) The accused has the opportunity to respond.

Annex 3

SWIM ENGLAND LAWS and REGULATIONS

INTERNAL CLUB DISPUTES

1 CLUB RIGHTS and RESPONSIBILITIES

The rights and responsibilities of a Club in terms of its discipline, its internal dispute procedures and the sanctions it can impose are given in Swim England Regulation 281 which specifies:-

281. Club discipline and internal dispute procedures

281.1 For a breach of its own rules, but subject to Swim England Regulations 150 and 151, an affiliated club or body may:

281.1.1 apply sanctions to a member relating to activities wholly within its own jurisdiction up to and including suspension from any or all of them;

281.1.2 expel a member, provided that before doing so it informs the member of the alleged offence and gives them a reasonable opportunity to defend themselves against the charge. If the alleged offence is also a breach of Swim England Regulations the club or body shall not deal with it but may make a complaint under the Judicial Regulations.

281.2 A club or body may expel from membership and/or refuse to renew the membership of any member who has been suspended according to Regulation 109 or Regulation 241 provided that any such expulsion or initial refusal shall not be lawful after the 12 months immediately following the end of the suspension.

281.3 Each club shall include in its rules provisions specifying the procedures to be carried out to handle internal club disputes which shall include compliance with Swim England Judicial Regulations.

281.4 Any such provisions shall comply with the Swim England Recommended Club Constitution and the accompanying Guidance Notes.

2 COMPLAINT TO Swim England

Any dispute that involves an allegation of a breach of Swim England Law must be submitted to the Swim England and dealt with as a complaint under the condition of Swim England Regulation 150.4 and Swim England Regulation 281.1.2. Swim England Judicial Regulation 102 deals with the

circumstance of a complaint made to the Swim England It provides the necessary explanation that defines a complaint, the grounds on which a complaint can be made, who can make a complaint and the procedure to be used.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 102. Complaints

102.1 A complaint is a formal expression of dissatisfaction with the actions or behaviour of any person, including an individual or a club, or other body, or organisation or with alleged unfair practice in connection with the sport. Decisions of a club, body, organisation, association, County Association or Region on selection of teams may not be the subject of a complaint.

3 INTERNAL DISPUTES

When a dispute arises between two or more members of the same Club, body or organisation it must be handled using the Internal Disputes procedure specified in the Club Constitutional Rules and the following Swim England Judicial Regulations 150 to 155.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 150 General

150.1 The primary objective of the Regulations in this section is to set out ways by which a just outcome of an internal dispute between the members of a club, organisation, association or body may be secured as expeditiously as possible.

150.2 An 'internal club dispute' is a dispute involving an alleged breach of the club's rules, between two or more club members, any or none of whom may be an officer of the club, or one or more club members and one or more employees of the club (the 'parties').

150.3 Any dispute which involves an allegation that there has been a breach of Swim England Regulations by a member must be dealt with as a complaint under Regulation 102 and the other relevant Regulations.

150.4 If the dispute involves an allegation against a paid employee of the club the issue must be dealt with under the terms of their contract of employment.

150.5 A failure by a club or any of the parties to comply with these Regulations 150 to 155 inclusive shall be grounds for a complaint under Regulation 102.

150.6 Organisations, associations or bodies affiliated to Swim England shall conform with such parts of Regulations 150 to 155 inclusive as may reasonably be applied to them, in all respects as if they were a club.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 1 Sequence of steps to deal with a dispute

151.1 The parties shall use any reasonable means to settle the issues between them informally and amicably.

151.2 If such a resolution cannot be achieved, the dispute shall be referred to the Chair of the club committee or, if he is a party to the dispute, to another officer of the club who is not a party who within seven days of the reference shall appoint an independent person to act as a mediator between the parties. The mediator may be a member of the club or a member of another club affiliated to Swim England.

151.3 If the mediator is unable to bring about a satisfactory settlement within 21 days, the club committee shall within a further 14 days appoint a panel (the 'panel') to determine the dispute.

151.3.1 The panel shall consist of three persons who have not been involved in the dispute, either from the members of the club or, if this is not possible or desirable, from the members of any other club affiliated to Swim England.

151.3.2 The parties shall be given the opportunity to object to any of the members of the panel at least seven days before the scheduled date of any hearing. The club committee shall consider any such objections, decide whether they are justified and act accordingly.

- 151.4** If a dispute cannot be resolved fairly and amicably between the parties concerned, and does not include a breach of Swim England Regulations, it may be dealt with under the relevant provisions of Regulation 281 which deal with club rights and responsibilities.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 152 Procedure before a hearing

- 152.1** The panel members shall appoint one of their numbers to act as the Chairman and either appoint another of their number, or alternatively appoint an additional person without any other powers, to act as the clerk of the hearing.
- 152.2** The Chairman of the panel shall arrange the date of the hearing and notify the parties of the arrangements at least fourteen days in advance of the date set. The notified date shall not be changed unless one or more of the parties has a compelling reason for not being able to attend on the notified day or time.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 153 Procedure at a hearing

- 153.1** The procedure shall be flexible and it shall be the responsibility of the Chairman of the panel to ensure the orderly and effective conduct of the hearing.
- 153.2** The panel shall not be bound by the judicial rules of the courts of England and Wales governing procedure or the admissibility of evidence provided that the hearing is conducted in a fair and orderly manner and that each party is given a reasonable opportunity to give and call evidence, address the panel and present his case. The Chairman shall have the discretion to limit the number of witnesses that would otherwise have been called.
- 153.3** Witnesses shall normally be provided with an area outside the hearing room and not take any part in the hearing other than giving evidence and responding to questions
- 153.4** The parties shall be informed of their right to make a complaint under Regulation 102 if they are dissatisfied with the conduct of the hearing or the grounds upon which the decision was made or if they consider any sanction imposed to be disproportionate.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 154 Procedure after a hearing

- 154.1** The panel shall come to a decision as soon as reasonably practicable after the hearing and if possible announce its findings

and decisions orally to the parties.

154.2 Notwithstanding anything in Regulation 154.1 the Chairman shall notify the parties and, if the Club was not a party to the dispute, the Club secretary in writing of its findings and decisions within five days of the hearing.

Swim England Judicial Regulation 155 Considerations regarding children

155.1 Any person under the age of eighteen (a “child”) who is a party to a dispute or who has been called as a witness shall normally be accompanied by a parent, a person with parental responsibility or a suitable adult. The Chairman shall have the sole discretion as to whether a child is permitted to present or defend a case or be questioned as a witness and may order that the child be assisted or represented by an adult.

155.2 The Chairman shall give due consideration to any child attending a hearing as a party to a dispute or to give evidence and in particular:

155.2.1 No child aged fourteen or under shall normally be expected to attend a hearing to give evidence in person. His evidence shall normally be given as a written statement with the assistance of a Club welfare officer or other person acceptable to the child and parent. Questions and responses may be relayed by a panel member

If the child appears distressed the panel shall rely only on the written evidence:

155.2.2 A child over the age of fourteen shall only attend a hearing as a party to the dispute or to give evidence in person provided he wishes to, and the Chairman has consulted with the parent and child and is satisfied that they both understand the nature of the hearing and what will happen and that the child is competent to attend:

155.2.3 If there is a disagreement between parent and/or child and the Chairman on any of the considerations above, the Chairman shall consider requesting advice from the Independent Child Protection Officer via the Swim England Legal Department.

- 155.3** During the hearing, a child who is expected to give evidence in person and his accompanying adult(s) shall be required to attend only those parts of the hearing which are necessary for him to give his evidence and shall be provided with a separate waiting area with no contact with any of the [other] parties.
- 155.4** After the hearing the Chairman shall inform the parent of the panel's findings and decisions and shall discuss whether he or the parent shall inform the child.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING and WATER POLO CLUB POLICY DOCUMENTS and STATEMENTS

1 Background

Under Swim England Law and as part of the submission by the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club for SwimMark accreditation the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club is required to publish to all its members the management and operational policies of the club. The requirement is further reinforced by the affiliation of the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club to Swim England and to Swim England North West Region.

For information to Club members the current policy statements under which the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club will operate from 2020 are as follows:

2 Child Safeguarding Policy and Code of Ethics

The Club is not required to formulate its own separate policy for Child Safeguarding as it is a condition of Swim England Regulation 241.13 and Club Constitutional Rules 2.4.1, 2.4.2 and 2.4.3 that the Club and all the members of the club shall adopt the Swim England Child Safeguarding Procedures and shall recognise that the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility.

The provisions of Swim England Regulation 241 are applicable to Adults at Risk and those working with them in the sport of swimming, open water swimming, artistic swimming, diving and water polo in the same way as they apply to children or young persons and those working with them.

The degree of compliance of the club with all these requirements is examined as part of the two-year SwimMark accreditation submission. The continued compliance with the requirements is agreed on an annual basis when the Club submits SwimMark annual review documents.

The Swim England Child Safeguarding Regulation 241 is given in full in the Club Handbook and on the Club website. The Swim England procedure for dealing with child safeguarding is given in the Swim England Handbook and on the Swim England website. The Swim England Child Safeguarding Policy Statement as adopted by the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club is given in Appendix A below. The required Duty of Care by Swim England members and clubs as part of the Child Safeguarding Policy is Section 2.1 page 20 of the Swim England Wavepower Document 2020 – 2023 and the policies and guidance relating to the Club is in Section 2.4 of the Swim England Wavepower Document 2020 – 2023

(see paragraph 8 below). The club also operates by the Swim England Code of Ethics that is given as Annex 1 to the Club Constitutional Rules

3 Whistle Blowing Policy

The Club does not have a separately stated whistle blowing policy as the club as part of the SwimMark accreditation procedure has agreed to adopt the Swim England Whistle Blowing Policy. In addition, all members of the club are volunteers and as such they are not prevented by the club or any Governing Body Constitutional Rules, by the Members Code of Conduct or by any Role Description from informing either the club or a body inside or outside of the Swim England of any situation they may wish to bring to their attention. A copy of the Swim England whistle-blowing policy is given in Section 2.1 page 39 of the Swim England Wavepower document.

Standard procedures are in place by the Warrington Borough Council, by Livewire and by all the organisations to which the club is affiliated to allow complaints to be made or to refer actions and disputes to them. A condition of Swim England Law 3.1.1.1 is that the Region is responsible for managing the sport within the Region while Swim England General Regulation 64.1.2 makes the Swim England Board responsible for the focus and direction for the sport and for the activities of clubs and their members. Both the Swim England Board and the North West Region Management Board therefore have a responsibility for the good governance of clubs and their members and for dealing with issues presented to them by an individual member or by an affiliated club or organisation regarding the activities and responsibilities of members or organisations affiliated to Swim England

4 Guidelines on Confidentiality and Information Sharing

The Club operates within the guidelines set down by the Swim England in the Swim England Wavepower document. Swim England Wavepower guidelines on confidentiality and information sharing are given in Section 2.1 page 37 of the Swim England Wavepower document

5 Equality and Diversity Policy

The club diversity policy is specifically stated in Club Constitutional Rule 2.2.1 where the Club is committed to treating everyone equally within the context of its activity and with due respect to the differences of individuals. It shall not apply nor endorse unlawful or unjustified discrimination, and shall act in compliance with the protections afforded by the Equality Act 2010. The club ensures that equity as stated in the club rules and is incorporated in all aspects of its activities.

In addition, the Club is committed by the requirement of Club Constitutional Rule 2.2.2 to implement the Swim England Equality policy which recognises and adopts

the Sport England definition of Sports Equality. The policy is given on the Swim England website, [Diversity and Equality Policies](#) and is published in the Swim England Wavepower document

6 Anti-Bullying Policy and other Abuse

The Club Codes of Conduct for Club Members ensures that all of the coaches, officials, committee members, swimmers, players and their parents sign up to and follow the Anti-Bullying Code. The Swim England Policy and the Club Policy is that bullying, abuse or harassment of any individual is not allowed or tolerated. The activities undertaken by individuals or collectively by the members of the coaching staff that are considered inappropriate under the description are given in Section 2.4 page 59 of the Swim England Wavepower document.

There are wide a range of types of abuse that can be encountered, and these are summarised in Section 2.1 page 29 of Wavepower

- Ensure that all individuals who will be working or will work with children in either a paid or voluntary role have been recruited in accordance with the Safe Recruitment Policy contained in Wavepower.
- Ensure that all individuals who work with children in the organisation have received the appropriate training for their role and been provided, understand and adhere to the requirements of the Codes of Conduct and Wavepower.

- Provide all members of the organisation and parents/guardians of members under 18 with the opportunity to raise concerns in relation to a child's welfare in a safe and confidential manner.
- Ensure that all child safeguarding matters, whether they be concerns about child welfare or protection, are dealt with appropriately in accordance with the guidance for reporting and action in Wavepower.

development in swimming, para-swimming, diving, high diving, artistic swimming, water polo and open water swimming.

- Listen to any concerns the parent/guardian or child may have and seek advice (where appropriate) to resolve any concerns.
- Treat all personal information about children or their families on a confidential “need-to know” basis unless information sharing with others is required to protect and safeguard a child from harm.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING and WATER POLO CLUB SWIM ENGLAND LAWS and REGULATIONS

Under the Swim England Laws and Regulations a Swimming Club has specifically defined Rights and Responsibilities under the condition of affiliation to the Swim England and to a Region. A protest must now be handled within the requirements of a competition and a club can no longer deal with a complaint. All complaints must be passed to the Swim England for consideration. Swim England Judicial Regulations 281.3 and 281.4 now require a club to include in its rules provision specifying the procedures to be used to handle internal club disputes and for the procedures to comply with the provision of the Swim England Judicial Regulations 150 to 155.

In addition, once a club agrees to host a competition it must comply with the necessary Health and Safety requirements and must satisfy the promoter's conditions for the competition. The move by the Swim England to play all water polo matches in England under the FINA rules of water polo now places particular duties and responsibilities on the Referee(s) for the game. A number of the Swim England Regulations relating to holding competitions are given below.

PROTESTS

101 Protests Definition

- 101.1** A protest is an allegation that the Swim England Regulations, Technical Rules or the promoter's conditions governing a competition have not been complied with or have been misinterpreted.
- 101.2** A protest may be made by a competitor (who may nominate another person to act on his behalf) or a club, body or official taking part in the competition. A protest must be made orally to a referee, or if appropriate, to a water polo delegate, and confirmed in writing within thirty minutes following the conclusion of the event or match during which the incident giving rise to the protest took place unless the reason for the protest is known before the event or match, in which case the protest must be made as soon as reasonably practicable before the event or match starts. If a protest is made prior to the appointment of the referee(s) or the water polo delegate(s) then the protest should be made to the promoter who shall refer the protest to a referee or a water polo delegate when he appoints the referee(s) or the water polo delegate(s).
- 101.3** Where material facts are brought to the attention of a competitor, club, body or official taking part in the competition which if they had been known during that competition a protest would have been likely to have been made during that competition or within 30 minutes following the conclusion of the relevant event, a post-event protest may be made to a referee or, if appropriate, to a water polo delegate who may in his discretion deal with it as if it had been made under Regulation 101.2 provided they are satisfied that it would be in the best interests of the sport to do so and provided further that the individual or other person making a post-event protest did so as soon as was reasonably practicable after acquiring knowledge of those material facts.
- 101.4** A protest may not be made against a decision of a referee or any other official regarding placing, fouling or any other facts of a competition. A referee's interpretation of Swim England Regulations, Technical Rules or promoter's conditions must be accepted at the time but may be the subject of a protest.
- 101.5** An appeal ("a protest appeal") may be made against the decision of a water polo delegate or a referee on a protest (Regulation 108.1).
- 101.6** The promoter of an event at which a protest has been made shall take possession of and store any documents relating to the protest and its

resolution or otherwise, for a period of not less than 12 months after the event.

156 Procedure to deal with a protest

156.1 The procedures for dealing with a protest are set out in Regulations 413,414 and 415

157 Procedure to appeal against a referee's decision on a protest

157.1 An appeal against a decision of a referee in regard to a protest shall be made by completing a standard protest appeal form (available from the Office of Judicial Administration), together with appropriate fee. (See Swim England Regulations 101.4 and 110). The completed form (and any other communications to the Office of Judicial Administration under the Swim England Regulations) shall be sent to the Office of Judicial Administration c/o British Para-Swimming St James Building Floor 2, 79 Oxford Street, Manchester M1 6FQ

158 Procedure to appeal against an automatic suspension for a breach of FINA Water Polo Rules

158.1 An appeal against the imposition of an automatic suspension for a breach of FINA Water Polo Rules shall be made by sending to the Office of Judicial Administration, a completed standard water polo appeal form (available from the Office of Judicial Administration). (See Regulations 108.6)

COMPLAINTS

Any dispute that involves an allegation of a breach of Swim England Law must be submitted to the Swim England and dealt with as a complaint under the condition of Swim England Regulation 150.3 and Swim England Regulation 281.1.2. Swim England Judicial Regulation 102 deals with the circumstance of a complaint made to the Swim England. It provides the necessary explanation that defines a complaint, the grounds on which a complaint can be made, who can make a complaint and the procedure to be used.

102 Complaint to Swim England

102.1 A complaint is a formal expression of dissatisfaction with the actions or behaviour of any person, including an individual or a club, or other body, or organisation or with alleged unfair practice in connection with the sport. Decisions of a club, body, organisation, association, County Association or Region on selection of teams may not be the subject of a complaint.

102.2 If a person, club or other body or organisation is dissatisfied with a decision of a Committee appointed under the Articles an appeal may be made by lodging a complaint with the Judicial Administrator under this Regulation 102 (See Regulation 159). In such cases only decisions of a disciplinary nature may be the subject of an appeal. Decisions made in the normal course of the business of a Committee on administrative and technical matters, appointments and selection of teams may not be the subject of an appeal.

102.3 No complaint may be made under the Judicial Regulations against an employee of the Swim England relating to any action taken in the course of their employment. Any complaint about such an action shall be dealt with by Swim England and should be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer.

102.4 Grounds for a complaint shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

102.4.1 misconduct;

102.4.2 "serious misconduct"; being any action, behaviour or practice liable to bring the sport into disrepute;

102.4.3 maladministration or breach of Swim England Regulations or the rules of a club, body or organisation etc.

102.4.4 a breach of the Swim England/ Institute of Swimming Code of Ethics.

102.5 A complaint may be made by:

- 102.5.1** any member who is aged 18 years or over on the date of the complaint;
- 102.5.2** the parent of or other person with parental responsibility for a member, who is aged under 18 years on the date of the complaint, on his behalf;
- 102.5.3** any affiliated club, body, organisation, association, County Association or Region through its secretary or other officer acting on its behalf;
- 102.5.4** the Board or any committee of the Swim England, Region or affiliated organisation through its secretary or other officer acting on its behalf;
- 102.5.5** a person officiating at an event;
- 102.5.6** any member of an Associated Organisation, a Corporate Organisation, an Associate Association, or an Affiliated Body who is aged 18 years or over on the date of the complaint. Any such complaint may only be made relative to swimming related activities in which the complainant was engaged;
- 102.5.7** the parent of or other person with parental responsibility for a member of an Associated Organisation, a Corporate Organisation, an Associate Association or an Affiliated Body, who is aged under 18 years on the date of the complaint, on his behalf. Any such complaint may only be made relative to swimming related activities in which the member was engaged.
- 102.6** A complaint which the Commissioner determines (in accordance with Regulation 160) raises an allegation which is properly to be categorised as misconduct and refers the matter to be dealt with by a Disciplinary Committee shall be prosecuted by the complainant pursuant to the disciplinary procedure. (See Regulations 162 et seq.).
- A complaint which the Commissioner determines (in accordance with Regulation 160) raises an allegation which is properly to be categorised as serious misconduct liable to bring the sport into disrepute and refers the matter to be dealt with by a Disciplinary Committee shall be prosecuted by a Disciplinary Officer pursuant to the disciplinary procedure. (See Regulations 162 et seq.).
- Any other complaint that is permitted to proceed shall be decided by the Commissioner or dealt with under the dispute resolution procedure. (See Regulations 167 et seq.).
- 102.7** A complaint must normally reach the Judicial Administrator not later than thirty days after the alleged incident that gave rise to it.

159 Procedure to make a complaint

159.1 A complaint shall be made by sending to the Office of Judicial Administration a completed standard complaint form (available from the Office of Judicial Administration) incorporating a detailed written statement of the matter(s) with which the complainant is dissatisfied and the reasons for the dissatisfaction stating, where relevant, the Swim England Regulation violated or the particular breach of the Swim England Code of Ethics. The complaint must be accompanied by the fee (see Regulation 110). The Office of Judicial Administration shall forward a copy of the completed complaint form as soon as reasonably practicable to the Commissioner

HEALTH AND SAFETY

203 Duties of all persons

Any person participating in any activity organised by an affiliated club, body or organisation including, but not being limited to, any promoter, competitor, official or spectator at any competition in any swimming discipline held in England under Swim England Regulations and Technical Rules or FINA Rules shall:

203.1 comply with the following:

- 203.1.1** any relevant statutory health and safety requirements;
- 203.1.2** any bye laws or other regulations relating to safety;
- 203.1.3** the conditions of any hire agreement relating to safety;
- 203.1.4** safety instructions or guidance issued by the Swim England or any other body approved by the Board.

203.2 take reasonable care for the health and safety of himself and other persons who may be affected by his acts or omissions within the area for which the promoter, hirer or organiser of the activity is responsible.

204 Duties of the promoter

The promoter of a competition shall have overall responsibility for the observance and enforcement of the safety requirements and his duties shall include but not be limited to the following. The promoter shall:

- 204.1** agree with the owner/operator the areas for which the promoter, as hirer, is responsible;
- 204.2** obtain a copy of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures from the owner/operator and have it available for reference during the period of hire;
- 204.3** make arrangements for the implementation of relevant sections of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures (as required by the pool hire agreement) during the period of hire;
- 204.4** brief the referee(s) prior to the competition; on the relevant sections of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures and the Promoter's Conditions
- 204.5** appoint sufficient competent persons (each of whom shall be a member of an affiliated club) to organise and supervise warm-up and swim-down

sessions during the period of hire and brief them on the safety aspects of their duties;

- 204.6** ensure before a competition is permitted to start that first aid and safety equipment to be provided by the owner/operator is in place and ready and available for immediate use and that pool staff who are qualified to operate it are on duty;
- 204.7** ensure that all stewards, lifeguards and other safety staff are in place before any participants are permitted on the poolside, and that adequate numbers are maintained throughout the period of hire;
- 204.8** prevent a competition starting if any of the required facilities and arrangements are absent or deficient;
- 204.9** be present throughout the period of hire of the pool for the competition or, for any period(s) in which they are not present, appoint a deputy to exercise the full powers of the promoter;
- 204.10** ensure, before start of each competitive session, that announcements concerning safety arrangements are made in accordance with the recommendations of the Swim England and indicating where a copy of the written Pool Safety Operating Procedures can be seen.

205 Duties of the Water Polo Delegate or the referee

The duties of a water polo delegate or referee shall include but not be limited to the following.

- 205.1** in addition to the duties set out in Regulations 414 or 415 and the relevant Technical Rules and conditions governing a competition, to be responsible for the safe conduct of all activities in those parts of the premises essential for the running of the competition;
- 205.2** To ensure that the minimum safe water depths and other dimensions and clearances, facilities and equipment comply with the current Swim England requirements;
- 205.3** to ensure that all officials are briefed prior to the competition on the safety arrangements and on any general safety matters (e.g. evacuation procedures) required by the Pool Safe Operating Procedures;
- 205.4** to stop a competition proceeding at any stage if any of the required facilities, equipment, personnel and procedures become deficient and report it to the promoter or his deputy.

206 Duties of officials and stewards

Any official or steward shall be under the control of the water polo delegate or referee at all times and, in addition to the duties set out in Swim England Regulations or the Technical Rules and conditions governing a competition, shall report immediately to the water polo delegate(s) or referee(s) anything that appears to him to breach, or be likely to breach, the safety regulations.

CHILD SAFEGUARDING

Definition and Procedure

241 Child Safeguarding

For the purposes of this Regulation 241, “child” or “young person”. means a person under the age of 18 years as defined by the Children Act 1989 and the Chief Executive Officer shall include any acting or interim Chief Executive Officer.

241.1 No person shall be permitted to be involved in any way with children in the sport of swimming, open water swimming, artistic swimming, diving or water polo under the jurisdiction of the Swim England unless:

241.1.1 they are a member of an affiliated club or of a club, body or organisation whose Child Protection Policies and the measures to enforce them are recognised by the Swim England; or

241.1.2 if this is impracticable, adequate provisions are made by the organiser of the activity or the promoter of the event to assess the risk and ensure that appropriate measures to protect any children taking part are in place.

241.2 In this Regulation the expression ‘Offence’ shall mean any one or more of the offences against a child within the meaning of Schedule 1 to the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000 as amended by the Sexual Offences Act 2003 and any other Offence which reasonably causes the Chief Executive Officer to believe that the person accused of the offence is or may be a risk or potential risk to children or young persons.

241.3 Upon receipt by the Chief Executive Officer of:

241.3.1 notification that an individual has been charged with an Offence; or

241.3.2 notification that an individual is the subject of an investigation by the police, social services or any other authority relating to an Offence; or

241.3.3 other evidence which causes the Chief Executive Officer reasonably to conclude that an individual may have committed an Offence then in any such case the Chief Executive Officer may impose upon the individual an interim suspension from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the Swim England or anybody directly or indirectly affiliated to the Swim England wherever held.

241.4 Upon receipt by the Chief Executive Officer of a recommendation from the Swim England Independent Child Protection Officer including the results of a Disclosure and Barring Service search or other information received which

causes the Chief Executive to conclude on reasonable grounds that the individual concerned is unsuitable to work with or have unsupervised access to children within the sport of swimming open water swimming, artistic swimming, diving or water polo the Chief Executive Officer may impose upon the individual an interim suspension or a suspension for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive Officer from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the Swim England or anybody directly or indirectly affiliated to the Swim England wherever held. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against the decision of the Chief Executive Officer to impose a suspension under this Regulation 241.4 (see Regulation 108.8).

241.5 In reaching his determination as to whether an interim suspension should be imposed the Chief Executive Officer shall give consideration, *inter alia*, to the following factors:

241.5.1 whether a child or children or young person(s) are or may be at risk of harm;

241.5.2 whether the allegations are of a serious nature;

241.5.3 whether a suspension is necessary or proportionate to allow the conduct of any investigation (by Swim England or any other authority or body) to proceed unimpeded.

241.6 Where an individual shall have been convicted or have been the subject of a caution in respect of an Offence the Chief Executive Officer shall have power summarily to impose the suspension for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive Officer of the individual from any event or activity promoted or authorised by the Swim England or any other body directly or indirectly affiliated to the Swim England wherever held. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against the decision of the Chief Executive Officer under this Regulation 241.6 (see Regulation 108.8).

241.7 if a Local Authority forms a belief under the formal belief system derived from the Children Act 1989, as amended, regarding an individual's suitability to work with children the Chief Executive Officer shall have the power summarily to suspend that person for a specified term decided by the Chief Executive from all Swim England activities, provided that:

241.7.1 the Local Authority has informed the Swim England that such a belief has been formed;

241.7.2 the person concerned has been formally made aware by the Local Authority that such a belief has been formed;

There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against a decision of the Chief Executive Officer under this Regulation 241.7 (see Regulation 108.8).

- 241.8 All affiliated clubs shall participate in and take reasonable steps to comply with the procedures of the Disclosure and Barring Service and its checking services in regard to Child Safeguarding matters and/or any subsequent procedures by the Swim England including but not being limited to requests for further information.
- 241.9 All members of affiliated clubs shall participate in and comply with the procedures of the Disclosure and Barring and its checking services in regard to Child Safeguarding matters and/or any subsequent procedures by the Swim England including but not being limited to requests for further information.
- 241.10 Any individual who fails to comply with a specific requirement of the Child Safeguarding procedures may be suspended by the Chief Executive Officer until such time as they have complied with any outstanding matters, provided that the individual has been warned of their liability to such a suspension. There shall be a right of appeal to the Independent Disciplinary and Dispute Resolution Appeals Panel against a decision of the Chief Executive Officer under this Regulation 241.10 (see Regulation 108.8).
- 241.11 A club, body, organisation or individual suspended by the Chief Executive Officer under this Regulation 241 shall not participate in any swimming activity organised by an affiliated club or controlled by Swim England Regulations. An individual shall not act as a representative of a club or other affiliated body nor shall ~~he~~ they be a member of any board, the Members Forum, committee, subcommittee or council concerned with the direction or government of swimming. An individual so suspended shall not act as an official at any competition, exhibition, meeting or any other activities within Swim England
- 241.12 The suspension of any individual for a specific term decided by the Chief Executive Officer imposed under this Regulation 241 shall not be lifted unless and until the individual has submitted to a formal forensic risk assessment with regard to their suitability to be involved with children in the sport of swimming
- 241.13 It shall be a condition of membership or affiliation to any Region of the Swim England that:
- 241.13.1 an affiliated club adopts the Swim England Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures; and
 - 241.13.2 the members of the affiliated club comply with the Wavepower Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures.

- 241.14 Without prejudice to the generality of Regulation 241.13 the Swim England may from time to time issue guidance or directions with regard to compliance with Regulation 241.13.
- 241.15 Swim England will promptly notify the individual of the details of any interim suspension or specified term suspension. The notification shall be copied to the applicable Swim England affiliated club, or anybody directly or indirectly affiliated to Swim England where held and the notification may also be made available to any relevant authorities, other sports governing bodies and/or any such other individuals and bodies on a need to know basis. 241.16
- 241.16 Adults at Risk
The Swim England Safeguarding Adults at Risk Policy which can be found on the website sets out the definition of an “Adult at Risk” and the procedures to follow if any concerns arise relating to an Adult at Risk. If an individual is working with Adults at Risk they may be in Regulated Activity as defined in the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 and the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 in which case it may be necessary to obtain a Disclosure and Barring Service disclosure and check the individual against the Adults barred lists. The provisions of Swim England Regulation 241 are applicable to Adults at Risk and those working with them in the sport of swimming, open water swimming, artistic swimming, diving and water polo in the same way as they apply to children or young persons and those working with them
- 241.13.1 An affiliated club adopts the ASA Child Safeguarding Procedures;
and
- 241.13.2 The members of the affiliated club comply with the Child Safeguarding Procedures.
- 241.17 Without prejudice to the generality of Regulation 241.13 the ASA may from time to time issue guidance or directions with regard to compliance with Regulation 241.13.

Objectives

This document outlines **LIVEWIRE** policy regarding use of cameras and other photographic equipment for third party hirers delivering sessions to children.

Policy Detail

Cameras and other photographic equipment including video cameras videophones are not allowed in the Centre during public sessions.

A third party hirer requires the written permission from the Centre Management prior to using cameras and other photographic equipment.

If authorisation is granted in writing the hirer should initiate a system to ensure compliance with the Data Protection Act and child protection issues. This means seeking written authorisation from a Parent/Guardian if recording photos/video of any person under the age of 16.

The system for ensuring compliance must have written approval from the Head of LIVEWIRE prior to use.

**WARRINGTON SWIMMING AND WATER POLO CLUB
GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF A CAMERA IN CLUB TRAINING SESSIONS.
Issue Date: August 2015**

Introduction.

The aim of this document is to provide guidance for the coaches and committee of the club as to the usage of a video camera in the club's private sessions and outlines why, when and how this should be used by the coaching staff at the Club.

ASA policy is that general videoing of swimmers under the age of 18 is not recommended, however this usage is not intended for general video or photography. These guidelines do not cover the use of a video or still camera at a gala or for general session photography. The use of fixed underwater cameras is becoming more commonplace during public sessions, with several pool operators in the UK using them to monitor and record the general public.

It should be noted that the camera is intended primarily to take underwater video footage of an individual swimmer to assist in stroke development. At times, above water footage may be taken and this will be of one swimmer at a time to assist in stroke development.

Background.

As the technology to video under water is becoming more readily available, this analysis is becoming more common. Video analysis is a very powerful tool for the coaches and is being used by more and more clubs as an aid to coaching and teaching as it allows the swimmer to see exactly what they are doing correctly and incorrectly. The clubs coaches will be videoing individual swimmers to help them improve their stroke technique, turns and starts.

If you would rather that your swimmer/player is not videoed, you should contact/email the club secretary and the head coach will be informed not to video that swimmer. If you have any queries on this, please email the head coach

Using the camera

The camera will be kept under the control of the head coach. The head coach will plan which sessions the camera is to be used, who is to use the camera, how it is to be used and inform the other coaching staff and club secretary. The club secretary will make a note of these sessions for adding to the minutes of the next committee meeting.

The head coach will outline the plans for the video analysis in the coaches' meetings and update on the effectiveness of the previous sessions.

The head coach will choose one lane for analysis. This lane, for practical purposes, will need to move into lane eight (or lane six at Sankey) for this session. The swimmer will be told what to do during the recording.

Once the footage has been recorded, it can then be uploaded to the computer for analysis. This analysis is best effected immediately after the recording is taken and can be done one-on-one by a second coach, while the next swimmer is being videoed. Where practical, written notes can be made and added to the CD to back up the verbal analysis.

The swimmer should then repeat the same stroke/turn/start and review the video again to monitor improvements.

The swimmer should be encouraged to review the video CD with their parent/guardian after the session to reinforce the instruction.

Data protection.

The resulting video will be recorded to a CD and given to the swimmer at the end of the session. If the swimmer is under the age of 18, the parent/guardian will be informed. No footage will be stored on any computer and at the end of the session any footage not recorded to a CD will be deleted. If any further analysis is required, the swimmer will be asked to bring along the CD for discussion with a coach. Any analysis off poolside will be with the agreement of the parent/guardian and another member of the coaching staff or committee.

Disclaimer.

Over the coming months the club's coaches will be videoing swimmers to help them improve their stroke technique, turns and starts.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING and WATER POLO CLUB
Incidents Occurring at Club Sessions
As at December 2020

Background

If an incident occurs at any club session it is important it is handled in the most appropriate manner, by the individuals who are authorised to deal with the incident and in accordance with the Laws, Rules and Regulations that govern the affiliation of the club to Swim England

Incidents at an External Event

Incidents that occur when the club is at a swimming competition or at a water polo match are classed as either internal when it involves one or more members of the club or external when it involves the conduct of the competition. An external incident is handled as a protest.

A protest is an allegation that the Swim England Laws, Regulations, Technical Rules or the promoter's conditions governing a competition have not been complied with or have been misinterpreted. A protest must be made orally to a referee or water polo delegate and confirmed in writing within thirty minutes following the conclusion of the event or match during which the incident giving rise to the protest took place.

A decision on a protest is made by the referee, the water polo delegate or the Jury of Appeal appointed to the event and the decision is final

Internally Reported Incidents

The types of incidents that occur internally within a swimming and water polo club sessions are many and varied. The procedure to be used when an incident is reported depends entirely on the nature of the incident. Different procedures are required to deal with the different types of incidents. In general the internal incidents reported to the club can be classified as:

- Disciplinary
- Welfare
- Disputes or disagreements

Disciplinary Incidents

At a club session the members of the poolside staff present at the session are directly responsible for the discipline of the swimmers or players under their control.

At a competition, the Team Coach and Team Manager are responsible for the discipline of the swimmers or water polo players in the team.

Under the provision of the present Club Constitution the poolside staff or the team officials have the authority to temporarily suspend or exclude any member from any particular training session or wider club activities for a lack of discipline or an alleged infringement of the codes of conduct. Once the period of suspension or exclusion has been served the incident is closed and the individual can return to the club sessions.

If the member of the poolside staff considers that a suspension is insufficient and further action is required the incident must be reported to the club committee in writing via the Chairman or Secretary and dealt with in accordance with the disciplinary procedures. In all cases a report must be given in writing to the club before the club can take any formal action.

Child Welfare and Child Safeguarding Incidents

Not all incidents are child welfare incidents. The club Welfare Officer is responsible for incidents involving the welfare and safety of vulnerable adults and any children in the club of 18 years of age and below.

Child Welfare

Any report that involves an alleged infringement of a Code of Conduct, Code of Ethics, or a published policy should be passed to the Welfare Officer to determine if it is a welfare issue and what or if further action should be taken. The Welfare Officer will deal with any welfare issues in a manner considered most appropriate to the Welfare Officer. The Welfare Officer should be able to address issues relating to bullying through the club's own disputes procedure.

Child Safeguarding

Any concern of a child safeguarding nature with regard to any individual involved in the sport of swimming must be referred to the Legal Affairs Department normally through the club Welfare Officer. The concern or query will then be noted and referred to the Swim England Independent Child Protection Officer (ICPO) for her initial assessment. The ICPO will report her views and any recommended course of action to the Swim England Legal Affairs Department and a decision will be taken as to how the matter will proceed.

Disputes and Disagreements

An internal club dispute is a disagreement between the members of the same club, organisation, association or body. It is a disagreement involving alleged inappropriate behaviour or an alleged breach of the Constitutional Rules of the club, or the Laws, Rules or Regulations of any organisation, association or body to which

the club is affiliated. It is a disagreement between two or more members of the same club, organisation, association or body.

If a dispute cannot be resolved fairly and amicably by arbitration between the parties concerned and does not involve an alleged breach of Swim England Law it may be dealt with using the Internal Club Dispute procedure specified in the Club Constitutional Rules and in Swim England Judicial Regulations.

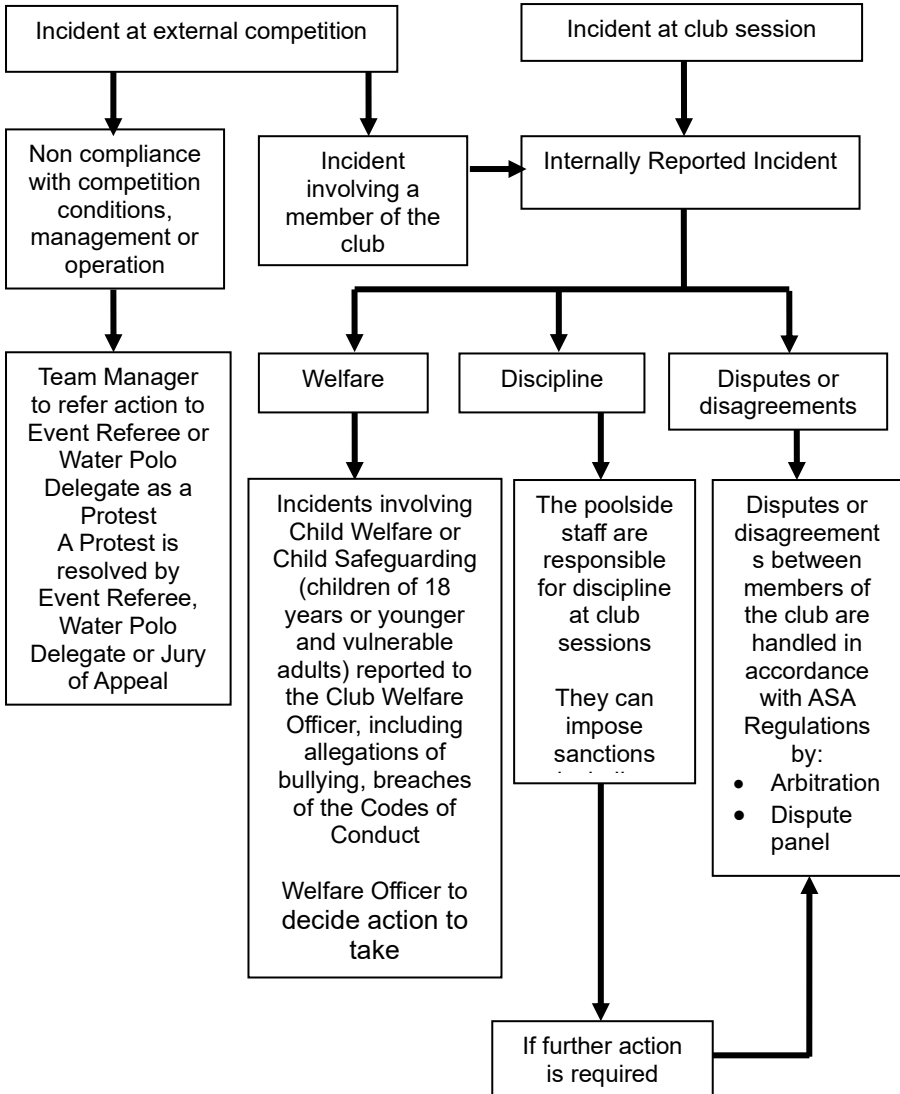
Any dispute which involves an allegation that there has been a breach of ASA Law by a member must be dealt with as a complaint and submitted to the Swim England

Complaints

Any dispute that involves an allegation of a breach of Swim England Law must be submitted to the Swim England and dealt with as a complaint under the condition of Swim England Regulation 150.4 and Swim England Regulation 281.1.2.

A complaint is a formal expression of dissatisfaction with the actions or behaviour of any person, including an individual or a club, or other body or organisation or with alleged unfair practice in connection with the sport.

WARRINGTON SWIMMING and WATER POLO CLUB SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIP AND AGE GROUP CONDITIONS

The Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club Championship and Age Group Competition conditions are not part of the Constitutional Rules of the Club and are therefore published separately.

1 General Championship Conditions

- 1.1 The Swimming Championships shall take place annually at venues and on dates decided by the Management Committee.
- 1.2 The Championships shall normally take place in October of each year on dates to be decided by the Management Committee.
- 1.3 Any alteration to the conditions of any Championship or any other competition shall be subject to approval by the Management Committee.
- 1.4 Entry fees shall be as set by the Management Committee.
- 1.5 All Championships events will be held in accordance with the appropriate ASA Laws, Regulations and the ASA Technical Rule of Swimming.
- 1.6 The Club Championships shall be open to all members of the Club.
- 1.7 Any competitor failing to comply with any of the conditions may be disqualified and shall forfeit any fee paid.

2 Championship Entries

- 2.1 Entries must be made on the official entry forms of the club to reach the Hon. Championship Secretary by the specified closing date, accompanied by the entry fee.
- 2.2 In the age group events the age shall be the age as at 31st December in the year of the competition.
- 2.3 In the case of entries to the Junior or the Age Group events the Parent or Guardian of the competitor must complete the official declaration of the date of birth.
- 2.4 Championship entry forms shall be made available no later than two months before the first Gala

2.5 The closing date for entries shall be at least two weeks prior to the first Gala and will be determined by the Management Committee.

2.6 Late entries will not be accepted.

3. Championship Events

3.1 Events shall be held in the following categories

3.1.1 Senior Championships

3.1.2 16 years and under (Junior) Championships

3.1.3 14 years and under competitions

3.1.4 12 years and under competitions.

3.1.5 10 years and under competitions

3.1.6 8 years and under competitions

3.2 The Management Committee shall be responsible for producing the programme of events with consideration being given to the number of entries in each event as to whether heats and finals are required.

3.3 Senior and Junior Championships are classed as separate competitions but are swum as a combined event, if heats are involved.

3.4 Unless agreed otherwise by the Management Committee all events including those having more than eight competitors, the results will be determined by heat declared winners.

3.5 The Junior Championship shall be awarded to the Junior swimmer with the fastest recorded time in the Championship.

3.6 All swimmers must swim in their respective Age Group up 16 years and under. The Senior Championships are open to swimmers of any age.

4 Definitions

4.1 A Junior is one who is under 17 years of age on 31st. December in the year of the competition.

5 Trophies

5.1 Winners shall be entitled to hold the respective trophies for the events up to one month before the next yearly competition. Upon expiration of this period or upon ceasing to be members of the Club trophies must be returned to the Championship Secretary

WARRINGTON SWIMMING and WATER POLO CLUB TROPHIES

Trophies have been presented to the club as follows:-

- 1897 **Champion Swimming Shield**
The trophy was presented to the club by the Licensed Victuallers Association, probably by the good offices of the Ashton family who were well known members of the club and Licensee's in Warrington. Mr A Ashton won the Senior Men's Freestyle Championship of the club in 1899 and held the office of Chairman of the club from 1915 to 1941 and from 1943 to 1946. He was made a Life Member of the club in 1930 and died in 1961. Mr C Ashton was the club Secretary in 1904 and 1905 and was a Life Member of the club from 1924 to his death in 1970.
- 1897 **Henry Thornton Rose Bowl**
Presented to the club by Mr. Henry Thornton, An Auctioneer and Accountant and a prominent member of the town.
- 1904 **Sir Gilbert Greenall Challenge Shield**
Presented to the club by Sir Gilbert Greenall Bart. who became the first Lord Daresbury in 1928. He was Vice President of the club up to his death in 1938.
- 1923 **Alderman Bolton Perpetual Trophy**
Presented to the club by Alderman Bolton in 1923 according to club minutes but has names on the trophy from 1920. Alderman Bolton was Mayor of Warrington from 1903 to 1906.
- 1925 **The Eustance Trophy**
Presented to the club by Eustance & Co Ltd. a well-known company of jewellers in the town at that time.
- 1933 **Margaret Hallaway Trophy**
Presented to the club by Mrs. Margaret Hallaway, wife of the then Town Clerk. Mr Hallaway served as Town Clerk of Warrington for the period 1918 - 1939.
- 1933 **The Wardonia Perpetual Trophy**
Presented to the club by Thomas Ward Ltd. a well known company of Cutlers in Warrington at that time.

- 1947 The Rowland Lord Memorial Trophy
Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. E Lord in memory of their son Rowland, killed at sea in 1944. Rowland Lord was an outstanding swimmer in the club and winner of the Senior Mens Freestyle Championship of the club on five occasions from 1933 to 1937.
- 1949 Mabel Briscoe Trophy
Presented to the Club by Major and Mrs. Briscoe. Major Briscoe was a prominent member of the town.
- 1951 1951 Festival Trophy
Presented to the Club by Mrs Vera Dacey on behalf of the then Ladies Committee of the club in recognition of the Festival of Britain celebration in 1951 and allocated to the Ladies 100 metres Breaststroke event.
- 1951 1951 Festival Trophy
A second trophy presented to the Club by Mrs Vera Dacey on behalf of the then Ladies Committee of the club in recognition of the Festival of Britain celebration in 1951 and allocated to the Men's 100 metres Breaststroke event.
- 1952 Festival of Britain Trophy
Presented to the club by the Warrington Borough Council Parks and Baths Committee to mark the Festival of Britain celebration in 1952. The trophy is allocated to the Senior Men's Swimmer of the Year.
- 1952 Queen Elizabeth II Coronation Trophy
The trophy was presented to the club by the Warrington Borough Council Parks and Baths Committee to mark the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1952. The trophy is allocated to the Senior Women's Swimmer of the Year.
- 1956 Eugene Dell Trophy
Presented to the club by the family of Eugene Dell to mark his 50 years of service to the club. Although never holding office in the Club he was a long time supporter of the activities of the Club.
- 1959 R W Cook Challenge Cup
Presented to the club by Mr R W Cook, a well-known Estate Agent in Warrington at that time.
- 1959 Ada Clegg Trophy

Presented to the club by Mrs Ada Clegg, daughter of Mr R W Cook. Allocated to the Girls 100 metres Individual Medley championship but withdrawn in 1975 due to excessive damage that could not be repaired.

1959 A Clegg Trophy

Presented to the club by Mrs Ada Clegg, daughter of Mr R W Cook. Allocated to the Senior Women's 200 metres Individual Medley championship.

1966. Clayton Challenge Cup

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs J G Clayton. Both Mr. and Mrs. Clayton were for many years members of the General Management Committee of the club and Mr. Geoffrey Clayton held the office of Chairman of the club in 1974 and 1975.

1967 Rathmill Challenge Cup

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs J R Rathmill. For many years Mrs. B Rathmill was a member of the then Ladies Committee and Mr. J R Rathmill was a member of the Management Committee of the club. Mr. Roy Rathmill held the office of Chairman of the club in 1987 and 1988, then in 1995 and 1996 and again in 2007 and 2008. He held the position of Club Secretary from 1970 to 1973, from 1975 to 1984 and in 1990 and 1991. Roy Rathmill was elected a Life Member of the club in 1984 for his services to the club. For a number of years he represented the Club on the Executive Committee of the Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association. He remained an active member of the club until his death in June 2013.

1967. Eric B Barton Memorial Trophy

Presented to the club by Mrs. Barton in memory of her husband Eric. Mrs. Barton served on the then Ladies Committee of the club for a number of years but Mr Barton never held office in the club. Their daughter Pat was a Club championship winner who represented the club for a number of years.

1968 Williams Challenge Cup

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. R Williams. For many years Mrs. Williams served on the then Ladies Committee and Mr. Williams was a member of the Management Committee of the club. Their daughter Avis was an outstanding butterfly swimmer winning a number of club championships and represented Wales on several occasions in international meets.

1969 Savage Challenge Cup

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. Savage. Although never holding office in the club they supported many club activities, particularly in the years their son represented the club in swimming events

1973. G E Massey Cup

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. G E Massey. For a number of years Mrs. Massey served on the then Ladies Committee of the club. They supported the club activities for a number of years when their son Graham played water polo in a number of junior championship winning teams at Liverpool and District and Cheshire County level.

1973 Buckley Challenge Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Buckley. Mrs Dorothy Buckley served on the Management Committee of the club for very many years and held the position of Chairman of the club in its Centenary year of 1979 and in 1980. Mrs. Buckley was elected a Life Member of the club in 1980 for her services to the club. Mr and Mrs Buckley are the parents of Alistair Buckley a championship winning swimmer and from 1979 he was for many years a Great Britain international water polo player.

1974 William Henry Ellis Memorial Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. Roy Ellis in memory of his father. Although never seeking office in the club William 'Bill' Ellis was an active member of the club over a very long period of time and was actively engaged in teaching swimming right up to his death in 1974.

1975 R A Clayton Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. R A Clayton. For a number of years both Mr. and Mrs. Clayton were members of the Management Committee of the club. Mr. Alan Clayton held the office of Chairman of the club in 1976.

1975 A W Taylor Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. A W Taylor. Mr. Taylor was a member of the Management Committee of the club for a number of years up to his death in 1981 but never held office in the Club..

1979 Centenary Challenge Trophy

Presented for competition by the Management Committee of the club to commemorate the centenary of the club in 1979 and allocated to the Girls 14 years 100 metres Freestyle.

1980 Jack Bayley Trophy

Presented to the club by Jack Bayley to commemorate his long association with the club, spanning a period of over 50 years, at the time of the presentation of the trophy. Winner of the club freestyle championship in 1930 and for many years a well-known water polo player for both Lancashire and

Cheshire Counties, a Northern Counties District referee and administrator, Jack Bayley also served as a member of the Management Committee of the club and as the Water Polo Secretary from 1952 to 1975. He represented the Warrington Swimming Club on the Executive Committee of the Northern Counties Swim England, the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association and the Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association. Made a Life Member of the club in 1961 in recognition of his outstanding service he remained active in swimming right up to his death in 1991. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years 50 metres Freestyle in recognition of the many young children Jack Bayley taught to swim.

1980. Jack Bayley Trophy

A second trophy presented to the club by Jack Bayley is allocated to the Boys 12 years 50 metres Freestyle.

1989. M Finney Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. Mike Finney who were for a number of years members of the Management Committee of the club. Mrs. S Finney held the position of Secretary of the club in 1992 and 1993. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 14 years Backstroke.

1989. M Finney Trophy

A second trophy presented to the Club by Mr. and Mrs. Mike Finney and allocated to the Boys 14 years Backstroke.

1990 Derek Flannery Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. D Flannery on his departure from Warrington to take up employment in Cambridge. Derek Flannery, a member of the club from an early age won a total of nine club swimming championships in the period from 1978 to 1984 and enjoyed a distinguished career as a water polo player in championship winning teams at ASA, Northern Counties District, Cheshire County and Liverpool and District level. The trophy is allocated to the Mens Junior 50 metres Freestyle Championship.

1991 Pam Caley Trophy

Presented to the Club by Mrs Pam Caley who was for a number of years a member of the Management Committee of the Club. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years Breaststroke.

1994 Pam Caley Trophy

A second trophy presented to the Club by Mrs Pam Caley who was for a number of years a member of the General Management Committee of the Club. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 12 years Swimmer of the Year competition.

1994 Eaton Trophy

Presented to the Club by Mr Ken Eaton who held the position of Chief Swimming Coach in the club for 20 years from 1987 to 2007. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 12 years Swimmer of the Year competition.

1994 Coaches Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr K Eaton who was the Chief Swimming Coach to the club at that time. Mr Ken Eaton held the position of Chief Swimming Coach to the club from 1987 to 2007. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 10 years Swimmer of the Year competition.

1994 Tom Hughes Memorial Trophy

Presented to the club by Mrs. Dorothy Eaton, the wife of the Chief Swimming Coach in memory of her father. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 10 years Swimmer of the Year Competition.

1994 Derek Musson Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr D Musson. Although never holding office in the club Mr Derek Musson was an active supporter of the club for many years. The trophy is allocated to the Girls 10 years Freestyle Age Group Competition.

1994. Warrington Swimming Club Trophy

Presented for competition by the Management Committee of the club in recognition of the introduction of the Age Group competitions. The trophy was presented to support the introduction of the Boys 14 years Swimmer of the Year championship.

1994 Warrington Swimming Club Trophy

A second trophy presented for competition by the Management Committee of the club in recognition of the expansion of the Age Group competitions. The trophy was presented to support the introduction of the Girls 14 years Swimmer of the Year championship.

1996 Warrington Swimming Club Trophy

Presented to the Club by Mr. D. K. Fleming when a member of the Management Committee of the Club and one of the Club Coaches. Mr Dave Fleming was the Membership Secretary of the Club from 1998 to 2004 and

during that time represented the club as the delegate to the Bolton and District Swim England. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 12 years Breaststroke competition.

1996 Warrington Swimming Club Trophy

A second trophy presented to the Club by Mr D. K. Fleming. The trophy is allocated to the Boys 10 years Freestyle competition.

1996 Chidlaw Challenge Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr. and Mrs. B. Chidlaw. Both Mr and Mrs Chidlaw were members of the Management Committee of the club for many years. Mr Bernard Chidlaw held the office of Chairman of the club in 1993 and 1994 and again in 2011, while Mrs Alice Chidlaw held the office of Chairman of the club in 1997 and 1998. Mr and Mrs Chidlaw were made Life members of the Club in 2002 in recognition of their services to the Club. The trophy is presented to the Women Junior 50 metres Freestyle Championship.

1997 D and G Chidlaw Trophy

A trophy presented to the Club by Denise and Gillian Chidlaw. The daughters of Mr. and Mrs. B. Chidlaw, they were both members of the club for many years as teachers and coaches. The trophy is allocated to the Mens 50 metres Freestyle Championship.

1999 May Challenge Cup

Presented to the club by Mrs Yvonne May, daughter of Mr and Mrs J G Clayton. Mr Geoffrey Clayton held the office of Chairman of the club in 1974 and 1975 and Yvonne Clayton represented the club for a number of years as a swimmer, winning the Ladies and the Girls Breaststroke Championships in 1967 and 1968. Mr and Mrs May have a daughter who was also an active swimming member of the club.

1999 Louise Appleby Trophy

Presented to the club by Louise Appleby a swimmer in the club at that time. She has subsequently qualified as a swimming teacher and is a valued member of the poolside staff in addition to holding the position of Events Manager for the club from 2013.

1999 Paul Appleby Trophy

Presented to the club by Mr Paul Appleby the husband of the then Club Secretary Mrs Maureen Appleby and father of the Club Events Manager Louise Appleby. Although never holding office in the Club Paul Appleby has been an active supporter of the club activities over many years. He is

The children were prominent water polo players for the club with Rafik being a Great Britain Junior International player.

After joining the club at the early age of 13 years in 1951 Yvonne Boyle represented the club as a swimmer on many occasions. For many years she was a member of the club including that of Committee Member for 30 years (1980-2010), Membership Secretary (1982-1987) and Chairman of the club on two occasions, first time in 1989-1990 and for the second time in 2009-

2010. Her presence at all our water polo matches where she acted as the match secretary for 40 years, at the swimming sessions, at the galas and competitions and at the committee meetings will be sadly missed. She was also the Secretary of the Warrington Sports Form at Great Sankey for 10 years. She was made a Life Member of the club 1990 for her services to the club and she remained active member of the club until her death in 2020.

In addition to being a member of the Warrington Swimming and Water Polo Club Alan Boyle has held positions with the Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association, the Manchester and District Swimming and Water Polo Association, the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association, The Northern Counties District of the ASA and with the replacement organisation the Swim England North West Region, with Swim England, the National Water Polo League and the Northern Water Polo League.

A member of the Club since 1952 Alan Boyle won a total of ten club swimming championships in the period from 1953 to 1966 and was the Swimmer of the Year in 1954. In addition Alan Boyle played water polo for the club for a period of 21 years from 1953 to 1974 in championship winning teams at Liverpool and District and at Lancashire County level.

Elected a member of the Club Management Committee in 1976 while still active on the poolside he has held office continually since that time serving as the Chief Swimming Coach (1976-1981), as the Chief Water Polo Coach for a total of 30 years (1977-1984 and from 1987 to 2010) winning some 60 plus water polo club championships as well as taking the club into the National Water Polo League on two separate occasions. First from 1981 to 1987 and again from 1993 to 1996.

He also served the club as the Water Polo Secretary (1976-1978 and from 1987-2014). He held the position of Swim 21 Co-ordinator from 2004 to 2015 thus helping the club to gain Swim 21 accreditation for teaching swimming for the period 2006-2010, for swimming and water polo at teaching and skills development level for the period 2010-2014 and at Essential level for the period 2014-2017. He held the office of Chairman of the Club in 1985 and 1986, again from 2012 to 2015 and again in 2019 to 2029 the office of Vice Chairman from 2016. He was made a Life Member of the Club in 1982 in recognition of his service to the Club.

In the Liverpool and District Swimming and Water Polo Association he has been a member of the Executive Committee since 1978 in addition to serving on both the Water Polo Committee and the Finance and General Purpose

Committee for very many years. He also held the position of Water Polo Secretary of the Association from 1981 to 1986, the office of Chairman of the Water Polo Committee from 1990 to 2016, the office of President in 1991 and 1992 and was made a Life Member of the Association in 2001 for services to the Association.

Alan Boyle has been a club delegate to Manchester and District Swimming and Water Polo Association from 2005 serving as a special advisor to the Water Polo Secretary. In 2015 he was elected to the position of President Elect of the Association and served as the President of Manchester and District in 2018 and 2019.

In Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association Alan Boyle was appointed first to the Water Polo Committee in 1976, then to the Executive Committee in 1978 and to the position of County Water Polo Secretary in 1980. A position he held for 36 years to 2016. He was the Coach/Team Manager to the Cheshire County Junior Team (18 years of age and under) for the ASA National Inter County Junior Water Polo Championship from 1980 to 1995 when the Championship was withdrawn by the ASA, winning the National Championship with the Cheshire team in 1983. In addition he held the office of President in 1988 and 1989 and was elected a Life Vice President of the County in 2001.

When the Management structure of the Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association was restructured in 2010 he was appointed the first Chairman of the new Executive Board, a position held until the Executive Board was dissolved in 2013 and replaced by a much smaller Executive Committee when he was the first person to be elected to the new position of Executive Committee Chairman. He served as the County Chairman from 2013 to 2016.

Alan Boyle was elected to the Executive Committee of the Northern Counties District in 1984 and over the next 21 years served as a member of the Water Polo Committee, the Finance Committee, the Facilities Committee and Chairman of the Water Polo Officials Committee serving as the President of the Association in 2000. The position of Facilities Officer was then held from 2002 until the dissolution of the Northern Counties District Association on 1st October 2005.

In 2004 Alan Boyle was elected to the new North West Region Shadow Board and on 1st October 2005 to the actual Management Board of the new ASA North West Region with a special responsibility for Constitutional Affairs after being appointed Chairman of the Region Governance Committee, a position

he still holds. He also served as the Water Polo Officials Co-ordinator for the North West Region from 2005 to 2013. In 2016 he was made a Life Member of the North West Region for his services to the Association

From 1988 to 2015 he was a member of the ASA Council first as a representative for the Northern Counties District and subsequently as an elected representative for the ASA North West Region. In addition to being a member of Council he has served on a number of ASA Committees and working groups including the Subcommittee on computing (1986/1987), the ASA Facilities Committee from 1998 to its closure in 2000, the ASA Water Polo Officials Committee from 2000 to its closure in 2005 due to a restructuring of the ASA committees, the ASA Health and Safety Forum (2000-2008) with a special responsibility for Water Polo, the Regionalisation Project Working Group (2003-2006) dealing with the introduction of the new Regional structure along with the development of the new Constitution and Governance of the new Regions,

At the ASA Council meeting in 2006 he was appointed Chairman of the ASA Working Group dealing with the proposed remuneration of the ASA Chairman and the ASA Board members that reported back to the ASA Council meeting in 2007, then from 2011 to 2013 he served as the Region representative on the ASA Governance Working Group for the reorganisation of the ASA Governance structures introduced at the ASA Council in October 2013. He served on the ASA Rules and Regulations Committee from 2007 to 2015 being appointed as the Secretary in 2009 and then the Chairman from 2012 to 2015.

After joining the Liverpool and District and the Northern Counties District Referees list in 1977 and qualifying for the National Water Polo League list of referees in 1982 he qualified to become a Nationally Graded Referee on the ASA list of referees in 1986. Subsequent to being a Nationally Graded Referee he refereed the Irish National Cup final on a number of occasions, the British Deep Water Championships, a number of ASA National Club finals as well as an International Masters Club Championship, an English Schools International Competition and an International Police competition. In 2002 he was the match secretary for the European Men's Water Polo Championships at Sheffield and in 2007 he was a goal judge at the same championships played at Manchester.

For 10 years from 1986 to 1996 Alan Boyle was an ASA Water Polo Tutor who delivered many water polo coaching courses at all levels throughout the country as well as in Ireland for the Irish Water Polo Association.

As the Chief Water Polo Coach of the Club Alan Boyle took the club into the National Water Polo League from 1981 to 1987 and again from 1993 to 1996. The club withdrew from the National Water Polo League in 1996 when the Club lost the facility of playing home matches on a Sunday at the Warrington pool due to a restructuring of the use of the pool facilities by the Local Authority. From 1993 to 1996 Alan Boyle served on the Executive Committee of the National Water Polo League.

He also coached the club in the Northern Water Polo League (1988-1993) serving as an Executive Committee Member from 1992 before being elected as the President of the League in 1994. A position he held for 23 years to 2017 when he was elected to the position of Life Member of the League.

In 2001 he received the Fred Moorhouse Water Polo Award for services to Water Polo in the Northern Counties District. In 2007 he was presented with both the Warrington Borough Council and the Cheshire County Sport Partnership Special Recognition Award for services to Swimming and Water Polo. In 2008 he was awarded the ASA North West Region Aquaforce award for his outstanding contribution to the sport at Region and County level.

In 2011 Cheshire County Water Polo and Swimming Association presented him with the John Wright Salver for Outstanding Services to the County Association over an extended period of time. In the 2015 New Years Honours List he was honoured with the MBE for services to Swimming and Water Polo which he received at Buckingham Palace on 26th June 2015.
